LDP Renewal Information

You can apply and pay online for your Legal Document Preparer Renewal Application using your check debit or credit card. In order to access the online renewal application, you will need:

- Your Arizona Legal Document Preparer Certification Number,
- Your email address on record with the Division, and
- Your date of birth on record with the Division

Applications postmarked or online renewal applications submitted on or after June 1, 2017 will be assessed an additional \$50.00 fee. Certifications not renewed expire July 1, 2017.

Please note the following:

In the event that you have filed a timely and complete application for renewal, your existing certification does not expire until the administrative process for review has been completed.

Business Exemption:

If your business is exempt from paying the renewal fee, you MUST complete and submit the Business Entity Exemption Extension form. <u>Click here</u> to download the form and mail it to the Certification and Licensing Division.
