## ANNUAL CASE ACTIVITY Narrative Summary

Total filings (including transfers in) decreased by 0.4% in FY 2001, from 2,453,077 in FY 2000 to 2,442,112 in FY 2001.

Criminal filings increased from 422,762 in FY 2000 to 429,979 in FY 2001, an increase of 1.7%. Civil filings increased 4.3%, from 245,133 in FY 2000 to 255,664 in FY 2001. Traffic filings (applicable only in justice and municipal courts) decreased by 1.3%, from 1,593,025 last year to 1,572,450 in FY 2001.

Total dispositions (including transfers out) increased by 5.6% from 2,238,183 in FY 2000 to 2,371,370 in FY 2001.

Order of protection petitions rose 9.9%, from 22,709 in FY 2000 to 24,955 in FY 2001. Emergency orders of protection were down by 13.3%, from 300 last year to 260 in FY 2001. Injunctions against harassment petitions decreased 0.7%, from 18,036 in FY 2000 to 17,905 in FY 2001.

The total number of trials held in the Arizona courts decreased in FY 2001 by 2.3% from 55,484 last year to 54,196 in FY 2001. The vast majority were court trials in limited jurisdiction courts.

Adults on probation as of June 30, 2001 increased by 4.2%, from 44,643 in FY 2000 to 46,526 in FY 2001. Juveniles on probation experienced a 3.1% increase, from 9,395 in FY 2000 to 9,684 in FY 2001.

There were 1,142 cases filed (including 2 reopenings) in the Arizona Tax Court during FY 2001, representing a 9.4% rise from the 1,044 cases filed in FY 2000. Recent changes in Arizona's tax law are reflected in case filings. Arizona Tax Court filings are reported in Superior court "other" category in the statewide totals.

## **COURT REVENUE**Statewide Narrative Summary

The statewide revenue data is provided here for each level of the Arizona courts. The first table shows the source and distribution of revenues collected by courts. The figures were compiled from probation fee reports and the quarterly revenue surveys distributed by the Supreme Court for FY 2001. Major revenue categories shown represent monies collected from four sources:

FINES, SANCTIONS, FORFEITURES: Revenue from monetary penalties assessed in criminal, traffic, and juvenile matters, and bond monies that were forfeited;

SURCHARGES: Revenue from monetary assessments authorized by statute above and beyond criminal and traffic penalties and certain civil and other fees;

FEES: Revenue from collectible fees for services of the court and chargeable aspects of case processing;

OTHER REVENUE: Revenue from sources not otherwise specified.

Total revenue collected by the Arizona courts increased from \$185,971,835 in FY 2000 to \$199,130,614 in FY 2001, an increase of 7.1%.

The first table shows that the fines category accounts for \$76,320,349, or 38.3% of the total. Fees make up the second largest segment of court revenue, totaling \$74,743,822, or 38.5%. The third largest revenue category is surcharges, with \$47,060,009, or 23.6% of the total revenue.

The second table shows that FY2001 court revenue, as in previous years, is distributed fairly evenly among the state, counties, and municipalities (29.9%-35.3%), and that Municipal Courts generate almost half of all court revenue (\$92,376,750, or 46.4%). The third table (on the same page) shows that the Arizona courts processed \$207,942,877 in "pass-through" trust monies, of which restitution accounted for \$15,966,208 of the total. The majority collected was in other trust, which represents 72.9% of the total.

The establishment of a central support payment clearinghouse to receive, disburse and monitor support payments pursuant to title IV-D of the social security act, which started to take effect in FY 1998, has moved all child support payments from the courts to the Department of Economic Security. The courts only collected \$409,005 in FY 2001.

# **COURT EXPENDITURES Statewide Narrative Summary**

The statewide expenditure information is provided here for each level of the Arizona courts. The first table shows court expenditures by source, fund, or other category. These data were compiled from Supreme Court financial records, program fund revertment reports, and annual expenditure surveys submitted to the Supreme Court for FY 2001. Major expenditure categories shown represent monies expended from five sources:

PRIMARY BUDGET: Expenditures of appropriated funds from the court's primary funding source, either the state (Supreme Court and Court of Appeals), the county (Superior and Justice Courts), or the city or town (Municipal Courts)--categories are kept as general as possible because line-item definitions for the state, counties, and municipalities vary widely;

STATE FUNDS: Expenditures of state program monies begun or renewed by the Arizona legislature and distributed to the courts;

FEDERAL FUNDS: Expenditures of federal program monies begun or renewed by the U.S. Congress and distributed to the courts (often via state agencies);

LOCAL FUNDS: Examples are expenditures from collections authorized by statute to reimburse all or part of the expenses of probation, automation, and other court services;

PRIVATE FUNDS: Expenditures of additional grants from other sources.

Total expenditures in the Arizona courts increased from \$454,271,367 to \$481,272,129 in FY 2001, up 5.9%. Primary budget expenditures account for 64.1% of the total. Salary and fringe benefit expenditures account for the largest portion (75.6%) of the primary budget. Outside primary budget expenditures, state funds account for the next largest group, at 28.9%.

The second table shows, as in previous years, that Arizona counties contributed almost half of the funds to operate the state's courts this year (\$247,016,396, or 51.3%). Likewise, the state again contributed approximately one-third of courts' expenditures in FY 2001 (\$160,730,883, or 33.4%). Expenditures from all five sources increased from FY 2000, and again, over two-thirds of these expenses were at the Superior Court level (\$325,199,829, or 67.6%).

## **COURT PERSONNEL Statewide Narrative Summary**

The statewide summary reflects all court positions as of June 30, 2001, including positions funded from both primary and non-primary budget sources. The information was reported by the individual courts in response to the Supreme Court personnel survey mailed in July 2001.

The total number of persons working full-time in the Arizona judicial system increased from 8,313 in FY 2000 to 8,463 in FY 2001, a 1.8% increase.

The most notable increases in full-time personnel appear to be in the position of Field Probation Officer (1,089 to 1,242). The courts employed an additional 1,027 part-time personnel, up 5.3% from 975 in FY 2000. The largest increase in part-time personnel appears to be in the position of Probation Treatment/Education (28 to 59).

The courts also had the services of 1,318 regular volunteers, an increase of 26.7% from the 1,040 in FY 2000. Volunteers include attorneys, court reporters, teachers, mediators, information desk personnel, Court Appointed Special Advocates, Foster Care Review Board members, and other professionals and non-professionals who serve as on-call magistrates.

Additionally, the courts utilized 195,211 hours of temporary personnel assistance. This is equivalent to 24,401 person-days, or almost 94 full-time employees (at 260 working days per year).

Some of the FY 2000 figures may not correspond to figures published in last year's Data Report due to corrected information received subsequent to publication of the Report. Personnel reports received from courts are checked for anomalies, but are not audited by the Supreme Court.
