ANNUAL CASE ACTIVITY Narrative Summary

Total filings (including transfers in) increased by 1.5% in FY 2005, from 2,499,668 in FY 2004 to 2,536,966 in FY 2005.

Criminal filings increased from 435,898 in FY 2004 to 439,106 in FY 2005, an increase of 0.7%. Civil filings increased 0.8%, from 308,068 in FY 2004 to 310,391 in FY 2005. Traffic filings (applicable only in justice and municipal courts) increased by 1.1%, from 1,566,629 last year to 1,583,538 in FY 2005.

Total dispositions (including transfers out) increased by 0.2% from 2,499,893 in FY 2004 to 2,504,811 in FY 2005.

Orders of protection petitions rose 0.6%, from 31,876 in FY 2004 to 32,057 in FY 2005. Emergency orders of protection were up slightly by 4.9%, from 103 last year to 108 in FY 2005. Injunctions against harassment petitions increased 4.0%, from 21,719 in FY 2004 to 22,577 in FY 2005.

The total number of trials held in the Arizona courts decreased in FY 2005 by 9.5% from 70,935 last year to 64,167 in FY 2005. The vast majority were court trials in limited jurisdiction courts. During FY 2003, Maricopa Justice Court Administration trained their court staff to count all appearances with a judge relating to forcible detainer cases as a court trial resulting in a sharp increase in court trials from FY2003 to FY2004.

Adults on probation (active standard and intensive) as of June 30, 2005 increased by 1.2%, from 36,803 in FY 2004 to 37,230 in FY 2005. Juveniles on probation experienced a 3.9% decrease, from 9,115 in FY 2004 to 8,762 in FY 2005.

There were 1,019 cases filed (including 19 reopened cases) in the Arizona Tax Court during FY 2005, representing a 20.1% decrease from the 1,275 cases filed in FY 2004. Arizona Tax Court filings are reported in Superior Court "other" category in the statewide totals.

COURT REVENUE Statewide Narrative Summary

The statewide revenue data is provided here for each level of the Arizona courts. The first table shows the source and distribution of revenues collected by courts. The figures were compiled from probation fee reports and the quarterly revenue surveys distributed by the Supreme Court for FY 2005. Major revenue categories shown represent monies collected from four sources:

FINES, SANCTIONS, FORFEITURES: Revenue from monetary penalties assessed in criminal, traffic, and juvenile matters, and bond monies that were forfeited;

SURCHARGES: Revenue from monetary assessments authorized by statute above and beyond criminal and traffic penalties and certain civil and other fees;

FEES: Revenue from collectible fees for services of the court and chargeable aspects of case processing;

OTHER REVENUE: Revenue from sources not otherwise specified.

Total revenue collected by the Arizona courts increased from \$252,328,885 in FY 2004 to \$284,160,280 in FY 2005, an increase of 12.6%.

The first table shows that the fees category accounts for \$111,597,228, or 39.3% of the total. Fines make up the second largest segment of court revenue, totaling \$102,375,768, or 36.0%. The third largest revenue category is surcharges, with \$69,203,435, or 24.4% of the total revenue.

The second table shows that FY2005 court revenue, as in previous years, is distributed fairly evenly among the state, counties, and municipalities (29.6%-37.5%), and that Municipal Courts generate almost half of all court revenue (\$139,632,632, or 49.1%). The third table (on the same page) shows that the Arizona courts processed \$127,797,214 in "pass-through" trust monies, of which restitution accounted for \$18,015,758 of the total. The majority collected was in "bail bonds", which represents 45.2% of the total.

The establishment of a central support payment clearinghouse to receive, disburse and monitor support payments pursuant to title IV-D of the Social Security Act, which started to take effect in FY 1998, has moved all child support payments from the courts to the Department of Economic Security. The courts only collected \$151,300 in FY 2004.

COURT EXPENDITURES Statewide Narrative Summary

The statewide expenditure information is provided here for each level of the Arizona courts. The first table shows court expenditures by source, fund, or other category. These data were compiled from Supreme Court financial records, program fund revertment reports, and annual expenditure surveys submitted to the Supreme Court for FY 2005. Major expenditure categories shown represent monies expended from five sources:

PRIMARY BUDGET: Expenditures of appropriated funds from the court's primary funding source, either the state (Supreme Court and Court of Appeals), the county (Superior and Justice Courts), or the city or town (Municipal Courts)--categories are kept as general as possible because line-item definitions for the state, counties, and municipalities vary widely;

STATE FUNDS: Expenditures of state program monies begun or renewed by the Arizona legislature and distributed to the courts;

FEDERAL FUNDS: Expenditures of federal program monies begun or renewed by the U.S. Congress and distributed to the courts (often via state agencies);

LOCAL FUNDS: Examples are expenditures from collections authorized by statute to reimburse all or part of the expenses of probation, automation, and other court services;

PRIVATE FUNDS: Expenditures of additional grants from other sources.

Total expenditures in the Arizona courts increased from \$529,226,762 to \$565,012,957 in FY 2005, up 6.8%. Primary budget expenditures account for 77.3% of the total. Salary and fringe benefit expenditures account for the largest portion (81.5%) of the primary budget. Outside primary budget expenditures, state funds account for the next largest group, at 18.9%.

The second table shows, as in previous years, that Arizona counties contributed almost half of the funds to operate the state's courts this year (\$356,442,378, or 63.1%). Likewise, the state again contributed approximately one-fourth of courts' expenditures in FY 2005 (\$124,950,798, or 22.1%). Expenditures from three out of five sources increased from FY 2004, and again, over two-thirds of these expenses were at the Superior Court level (\$403,496,725, or 71.4%).

COURT PERSONNEL Statewide Narrative Summary

The statewide summary reflects all court positions as of June 30, 2005, including positions funded from both primary and non-primary budget sources. The information was reported by the individual courts in response to the Supreme Court personnel survey distributed electronically in August 2005.

The total number of persons working full-time in the Arizona judicial system increased from 9,072 in FY 2004 to 9,123 in FY 2005, a 0.6% increase. The courts employed an additional 1,071 part-time personnel, up 2.2% from 1,048 in FY 2004.

The most notable increases in full-time personnel appear to be in the position of field probation officer (1,057 to 1,158) and "other court administrative" (834 to 920). The largest decrease in full-time personnel appears to be in the position of probation surveillance officer (300 to 198).

The courts also had the services of 2,013 regular volunteers, a decrease of 3.0% from the 2,075 in FY 2004. Volunteers include attorneys, court reporters, teachers, mediators, information desk personnel, Court Appointed Special Advocates, Foster Care Review Board members, and other professionals and non-professionals who serve as on-call magistrates.

Additionally, the courts utilized 82,862 hours of temporary personnel assistance. This is equivalent to 10,358 person-days, or over 39 full-time employees (at 260 working days per year).

Some of the FY 2004 figures may not correspond to figures published in last year's Data Report due to corrected information received subsequent to publication of the Report. Personnel reports received from courts are checked for anomalies, but are not audited by the Supreme Court.
