MOON VALLEY JUSTICE OF THE PEACE ANDREW HETTINGER REPRIMANDED BY ARIZONA COMMISSION ON JUDICIAL CONDUCT

PHOENIX -- On May 31, 2017, the Arizona Commission on Judicial Conduct issued an amended order reprimanding Moon Valley Justice of the Peace Andrew Hettinger for violating a number of rules in the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct during his 2016 election campaign for the position of justice of the peace.

The May 31, 2017 amended order sustained a reprimand initially issued by the commission on February 6, 2017. Pursuant to Commission Rule 23(b)(2), Judge Hettinger had requested a hearing following the issuance of the original reprimand. A hearing was conducted on May 15, 2017, and the commission issued its findings and sustained the reprimand in its May 31, 2017 amended order. A public reprimand is a public sanction issued when a judge's conduct is unacceptable under one or more grounds for judicial discipline, but is not so serious as to warrant further discipline by the Arizona Supreme Court.
