O R D E R

Applicant KRISTOPHER C. CHILDERS has established to the satisfaction of the Hearing Panel and this Court that his application for reinstatement should be granted. Pursuant to Rule 65 of the Rules of the Supreme Court,

IT IS ORDERED that KRISTOPHER C. CHILDERS is reinstated as an active member of the State Bar of Arizona effective the date of this order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that upon the effective date of reinstatement KRISTOPHER C. CHILDERS shall be placed on probation for a period of two years, under the terms and conditions as listed below:

1. Within thirty days of reinstatement, Applicant shall contact the State Bar's Member Assistance Program (MAP) and submit to an assessment. Applicant shall thereafter enter into a MAP contract based on the recommendations made by the MAP director or designee. As part of the MAP contract, Applicant shall continue bi-monthly counseling with his psychologist, Dr. Linda Collins, or another professional, for the duration of the probation period, or until modified by Dr. Collins or other professional. Applicant shall comply with all the terms of the MAP contract which shall be incorporated herein by reference. Applicant shall be responsible for any costs associated with MAP.
2. Within thirty days of reinstatement, Applicant shall contact the State Bar's Law Office Management Assistance Program (LOMAP) and submit to an assessment. Applicant shall thereafter enter into a LOMAP contract based on the

recommendations of the LOMAP director or designee. Applicant shall comply with all the terms of the LOMAP contract which shall be incorporated herein by reference. Applicant shall be responsible for any costs associated with LOMAP.

3. Applicant shall complete a course equivalent to the former Professional Ethics course during the period of probation and shall submit proof of the completion to the State Bar.
4. The State Bar shall report material violations of the terms of probation pursuant to Rule 60(a)(5), Ariz. R. Sup. Ct., and a hearing may be held within thirty days to determine if the terms of probation have been violated and if any additional terms should be imposed. The burden of proof shall be on the State Bar to prove non-compliance by a preponderance of the evidence.
