A.R.S. § 12-251(C) provides that “Probation department personnel shall qualify under minimum standards of experience and education established by the supreme court. Such standards may differ for counties of less than three-hundred-thousand persons from counties with three-hundred-thousand persons or more.” ACJA § 6-106(F)(1)(a), Personnel Practices, states that chief probation officers must possess “at minimum, a master’s degree in business, management, the social sciences or a related field from an accredited college or university. ACJA § 6-106(F)(2) provides that a presiding judge may request that the administrative director waive this requirement for good cause.

The Presiding Judge of the Superior Court in Cochise County has requested a waiver of this requirement pursuant to A.R.S. § 12-251(C). Cochise County is a county of less than three-hundred-thousand persons and has identified a hardship in the ability to recruit a chief probation officer who meets requirements regarding educational experience as stated in ACJA § 6-106(F)(1)(a). The waiver will provide the Cochise County Probation Department the ability to promote a current staff member to the position of chief probation officer, contingent on meeting these requirements within the 2013 calendar year.

Therefore, pursuant to ACJA § 6-106(F)(2),

IT IS DIRECTED that a waiver of ACJA § 6-106(F)(1)(a) is granted regarding the educational requirements allowing the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court in Cochise County to promote Ed Gilligan to the position of Cochise County Chief Probation Officer.
