Arizona Code of Judicial Administration § 6-113 (P)(1) provides: “An officer may only carry and use the firearm and ammunition that are approved by the AOC as their duty weapons.”

Pursuant to Arizona Code of Judicial Administration § 6-113 (P)(1), the Administrative Office of the Courts hereby establishes the following handgun and ammunition for Arizona probation use.

Glock Model 22, Model 23, and Model 27  
Speer Gold Dot 180 Grain Jacketed Hollow Point cartridge

Arizona Code of Judicial Administration § 6-113 (T)(1)(d) and (T)(4) provides “The chief probation officer may approve a warrants officer or fugitive apprehension officer who is a specialized non-case carrying officer assigned full-time to the duties of locating and arresting individuals on warrant status to carry a long gun. This approval shall be based upon the officer meeting the following criteria: . . . (T)(1)(d) “Is current with annual requalification standards for all authorized and approved firearms established by AOC.” and (T)(4) “The long gun and ammunition must be consistent with standards established by AOC.”

Pursuant to Arizona Code of Judicial Administration § 6-113 (P)(1) and (T)(4), the Administrative Office of the Courts hereby establishes the following long gun and ammunition for Arizona probation use.

Daniel Defense AR 15 .223/5.56 caliber Rifle w/ 12.5 inch barrel  
Duty round Federal 55 grain TRU Sierra gameking BTHP T223E

Arizona Code of Judicial Administration § 6-113 (P)(7) provides: “The chief probation officer or director of juvenile court serves shall approve holsters for the authorized handgun based on guidelines issued by the AOC.”

Pursuant to Arizona Code of Judicial Administration § 6-113 (P)(7), the Administrative Office of the Courts hereby establishes and issues the following guidelines for duty firearm holsters for Arizona probation use.

- A. Holsters shall:
1. Be readily concealable;
  2. Properly fit the firearm;
  3. Cover the trigger guard of the firearm; and
  4. Contain at least one (1) retention device other than friction.
- B. A Chief Probation Officer or Juvenile Court Director may authorize officers assigned to Fugitive Apprehension Units, or on special assignment for the purpose of an arrest, to use a thigh holster to increase access to their weapons while wearing protective vests.

Therefore, pursuant to Arizona Code of Judicial Administration § 6-113 (P)(1), (P)(7), (T)(1)(d), and (T)(4),

IT IS DIRECTED that the authorized firearms, ammunition and holster guidelines established above are adopted and shall serve as the basis for purchasing and wearing duty firearms and firearm holsters, effective this date.
