On December 20, 2006, Administrative Order No. 2006-120 was filed adopting education and training standards into the Arizona Code of Judicial Administration (ACJA) Section 1-302, including requirements for court staff to complete training in core curricula areas selected annually by the Committee on Judicial Education and Training (COJET).

The Committee on Judicial Education and Training (COJET), which was created in part to recommend changes in policies and standards governing judicial education, recommends suspending core curricula requirements in 2015 while changes to these requirements in the Arizona Code of Judicial Administration are considered.

Therefore, pursuant to Article VI, Section 3, of the Arizona Constitution,

IT IS ORDERED that the core curricula education requirements as established in the Arizona Code of Judicial Administration (ACJA) Section 1-302.H.5.a are suspended during calendar year 2015. All other provisions of Section 1-302, as originally adopted, remain unchanged and in effect.
