SCHOOL MISSION STATEMENT

Mohave County's secure care school program is designed to provide detained juveniles with a grade level appropriate education that includes transition from detention back into the community.

Specifics of our Program are:

Provide a continuum during absence from school.

Provide computer-based instruction that meets Arizona State Standards.

Address Individualized Education Plans from school districts (Special Ed.).

Provide testing for grade level placement.

Help students discover their career path.

Prepare students to take the GED test.

Administer the GED test to detained juveniles and probationers.

Prepare and register students for classes at Mohave Community College.

Provide life skills instruction.

Provide seamless transfer of class credits.

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SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN 2011- GOALS

- GOAL 1: Students will show measurable improvement in comprehension and understanding of mathematical operations.
- 10 out of 13 students fell far below on the AIMS Test in 2011.
- Of the students who completed pre and post test assessments in 2010-2011, 25% showed a gain of .5 - .75 grade levels.

- Students who did not show a gain did not adequately take notes during the study and practice exercises. Therefore, they were unable to use these notes to take the test.

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SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN 2011- GOALS

- **GOAL 2: Students will show measurable improvement in Reading, Understanding, and Literacy that is aligned with the AZ State Standards.**
- **According to A+ assessments, 33% of students who took both the pre and post assessments in reading showed a gain of .5 - 1.0 grade levels.**
- **Students who did not show a gain did not adequately take notes during the study and practice exercises. Therefore, they were unable to use these notes to take the test.**

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Annual Narrative Report 2011 School Curriculum

We have used A+L Anywhere software for our school's curriculum for the past few years. We also use Steck Vaughn materials to prepare our students for the GED test. Once students receive their GED, they are signed up for MCC classes, and follow the teacher's syllabus.

Probation officers are advised of every step taken in the education of one of their probationers, discussions are held between the teaching staff and officers as to which avenue would be best for the student in question. Our vision statement is displayed on all stakeholder related documents. Our health services, student hearing and screening programs, are ongoing.
