





Juvenile Crime Trends in Arizona


Types of Referrals to the Juvenile Courts FY08

Most Serious Offense While on Probation: Rates Per 1,000 Probationers




*Status offense are charges which would not be a criminal offense if offender was an adult.

Promoting Public Safety


- ◆ Provide community supervision

Indicator: *Law-Abiding Behavior*


Juveniles with no New Referral* within One Year After Probation and Diversion




Juveniles with no New Referral* During Probation

Accountability

- ◆ Holding the juvenile responsible for violations of the law ◆ Victim & community accountability
- ◆ Court compliance ◆ Includes juvenile, family, system and community accountability.

Indicator: *Family Fees (Monetary)*

	Probation	Diversion
% Responsible for Fees	74.5%	55%
% Of Responsible Paying Fees	74.6%	61.6%
Average Amount (per case)	\$387.59	\$57.28

*Probation is court-ordered community based supervision involving staff who monitor compliance to the ordered terms

**Diversion is a process to resolve offenses in a manner that involves compliance to assigned consequence conditions but does not involve formal court prosecution.

Youth Development


- ◆ Develop skills, abilities and social competency of youth involved in the juvenile justice system to become productive and responsible citizens.

73.3% of juveniles on probation during FY 2008 were enrolled in school or GED program.
