RESPONDENT.)	JUDGMENT AND ORDER
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This matter having come before the Disciplinary Commission of the Supreme Court of Arizona, it having duly rendered its decision, and there having been no discretionary or *sua sponte* review occurring,

IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that **VALERIE K. JUDGE-MYERS**, a member of the State Bar of Arizona, is hereby censured for conduct in violation of her duties and obligations as a lawyer, as disclosed in the Disciplinary Commission Report.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that **VALERIE K. JUDGE-MYERS** shall be placed on continued probation until March 19, 2010. The terms of probation are as follows:

1. Respondent is currently subject to a MAP contract that will expire on March 19, 2010. Respondent will be placed on probation to begin at the time the Judgment and Order is signed in this matter. The term of Respondent's probation in this matter is to continue with that contract until March 19, 2010. The probation will include all of the terms of the current MAP contract.
2. Once the Judgment and Order has been issued, Respondent will no longer be on conditional admission status.
3. Respondent shall pay all costs and expenses incurred by the State Bar in this disciplinary proceeding, as provided in the State Bar's statement of costs and expenses, attached as Exhibit A of the Hearing Officer's Report and incorporated herein.
4. In the event Respondent fails to comply with any of the foregoing terms, and the State Bar receives information about her failure, Bar Counsel will file a Notice of Non-Compliance with the Disciplinary Clerk. A hearing officer will conduct a hearing at the earliest practical date, but in no event later than thirty days following receipt of the notice, and will determine whether the terms have been breached and, if so, will recommend appropriate action in response to the breach. The State Bar shall have the burden of proving non-compliance by a preponderance of the evidence

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to Rule 60(b), the State Bar of Arizona is granted judgment against **VALERIE K. JUDGE-MYERS** for costs and expenses of these proceedings in the amount of \$859.00 together with interest at the legal rate from the date of this judgment.
