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Major Accomplishments of FY10



Juvenile Needs Assessment – February 2010

- Provided new/improved assessment that standardizes the process throughout the state and identifies/prioritizes needs of medium/high risk adjudicated juveniles
- Implemented “pilot” in Pima and 5 rural counties

Title IV-E Case Tracking – June 2010

- Automates case tracking for Title IV-E federal foster care program aimed at low income children
- To be implemented in Maricopa and Pima counties

Major Accomplishments of FY10



JOLTSaz

- Completed Dependency Module Pilot in Pima – July 2009
- Completed Detention Module Pilot in Pima including automated incident reports for screened/detained youth – August 2009
- Completed Dependency data conversion scripts – November 2009

Major Accomplishments of FY10



APETS Evidence Based Practices – August 2009

- Provided changes to assessment scoring and risk categories to align them with EBP
- Expanded Earned Time Credit and Interstate Compact tracking features
- Added edit/copy features to improve data accuracy
- Modified the case plan

Major Accomplishments of FY10



APETS Evidence Based Practices - April 2010

- Created a presentence-level document summarizing defendant's overall risk and criminogenic needs to assist the court in sentencing decisions
- Provided a means to track jail time and/or community restitution hours that Court allows Probation to impose as an intermediate sanction for non-compliance issues
- Revised Uniform Conditions to align with EBP

Major Accomplishments of FY10



Juvenile Civil Judgments - July 2009

- The process of generating civil judgments for juveniles that have outstanding obligations is another vehicle to increase revenue collections by the court
- This process was manual and labor intensive in the JOLTS system
- In iCIS, it is now a fully automated process

Major Accomplishments of FY10



Automated Collections – September 2009

- Collection accounts were recalled from any existing collection agencies
- The initial pull included over 80,000 qualifying obligations representing in excess of \$8 million owed to the court
- Collection letters are sent to the payers
- Payer's obligations electronically transmitted to the collection agency

Major Accomplishments of FY10



Address Process - September 2009

- Enhanced the address function within the case management system
- Provided increased security, confidential and protected functions
- Increased “Lives With” address management
- Provides ease of use in updating one or many address and parties

Major Accomplishments of FY10



Automate VOP Process - November 2009

- Provides a quick automated process of setting hearings from the creation of a VOP (Violation of Probation) to the VOP Hearing, through filing
- Producing a more efficient and accurate process of VOPs

Major Accomplishments of FY10



Victim's Enhancements - January 2010

- Completed rewrite of Victim Processes in Juvenile iCIS
- Staff do not have to personally mail victim notices
- Processing time of court documents is reduced
- Cost savings are realized through increased accuracy
- Victims receive timely and relevant information about their cases and their rights
- Elimination of manual processes in several areas

Major Accomplishments of FY10



CASA Enhancements - January 2010

- Provide a website for the public to learn more about the CASA program, to fill out an application, for the CASA to use to upload reports and for the CASA to get templates for reports and forms they need to do their work
- The CASA's are able to upload their Contact Logs and Court Reports to the Coordinator via the website which is accessible 24x7

Major Accomplishments of FY10



Re-write of the APD online – January 2010

- Downloads information from AOC
- Web based dashboard from APETS data
- UA referrals – client based
- Equipment Tracking - safety, cell phones, computer, radio and badges
- Employee inventory module for annual inventory verification
- APD Employee UA
- Dispatch

Major Accomplishments of FY10



Stand Down Audit – March 2010

- Successfully completed the preliminary and final stand down audit reports

Significant Enhancements – March 2010

- Completed 67 significant enhancements for ease of use, improved processing, and increased efficiency

Major Plans for FY11



JOLTSaz, SWID, JNA

- Complete development, conduct testing and begin rollout of JOLTSaz for Pima and 13 rural counties to include integration with CMS (AJACS and AGAVE)
- Complete Statewide Identifier (SWID) to eliminate duplicate work and make tracking juveniles across counties more efficient, promote juvenile accountability and increase public safety
- Roll out Juvenile Needs Assessment (JNA) statewide (including additional features/enhancements)

Major Plans for FY11



APETS

- Enhancement Builds will continue to incorporate changes to probation operations statewide that are supported by EBP
- Performance Measures process will be automated and redesigned around EBP for AOC's annual submission to the Legislature and JLBC
- CMS Integration with AJACS will reduce data entry, paperwork and timing delays as well as provide access to financial and calendaring information

Major Plans for FY11



APETS

- Pima Kiosk interface will import to APETS any changes/updates to probationer's address, phone and employment records
- ICOTS interface will import necessary client case and demographic data for a transfer request to another state

Major Issues for Consideration



- PACC shall monitor all probation automation activities that affect the courts at a statewide level, regardless of jurisdiction or funding source, in a way that increases coordination and fosters collaboration
