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## TOM HENRY RETIRES AS CASA



Recently Tom Henry hung up his CASA badge, after twenty-three years as a CASA! His tenure is the record for the Verde side of the county.

Tom is a native Arizonan, born in the copper mining town of Miami, and graduated from Globe High School and

NAU. After a year teaching in California, he returned to Arizona and taught for thirty years at Mingus Union High School, mostly English and Math.

Kids were his life, after having been a teacher and coach for over thirty years. He loves the Verde Valley and working with kids. After reading an article in the newspaper about the CASA Program, he decided this was another way for him to still be involved with kids, that he likes being of service to kids. Tom says he has worked with dozens of kids but prefers teens. His first case was with an adorable four-year old boy named Walter and he wonders what ever happened to him. Another of his boys lives in Michigan, is in his thirties and Tom has phone contact with him. Tom says the high point of his career as a CASA was the day he introduced his boy to the child's biological dad, a man Tom had taught at Mingus. At the case's conclusion, Dad was given custody. The boy in Tom's last case will soon age out of the program, but Tom has encouraged him to enter the Independent Living Program. Tom plans to maintain a relationship with this young man, and says he can do things with him he could not do as a CASA, like camp together.

In addition to being a CASA, Tom served the CASA program by writing a column for the monthly newsletter. Using the pen name, Miss Hansen, named after one of his former English teachers, Tom wrote columns on English grammar, especially as it applied to our Court reports.



### Court Report Writing Class

If you are new to the CASA program and have never written a court report, or if you have been a CASA and can use a refresher, please plan on joining us on August 21st from 11:00-12:30 to learn about writing a CASA court report. In addition to the class, there is a training module for court report writing on the AZ CASA website. If you go through the module, be sure to print out the certificate at the end and bring it to the CASA office for training credit.



Sometimes we are surprised. Even when a case is over, we will remember the children and we hear from them occasionally. A few years ago David and I were CASAs in a case for two children; same mother different fathers. As the case closed, one child was adopted by his 'forever' parents and the other child was returned to the father and moved away. We send birthday and holiday cards to the children and most of the time, they respond with a phone call. It's wonderful to hear the voices change from a scared 5 year old to a confident 10 year old. They will send us school pictures and hand drawn cards telling us about their schools, friends, sports and activities. One little girl called us to tell us about a reading award she had received. These are the moments that you say to yourself, maybe we made a difference in their lives.

Just the other day this 10 year old boy called us and thanked us for the birthday card. It was such a pleasant surprise to hear his voice. He is very happy and does so many things with his forever parents. One of the things he does is play soccer, and has promised to send us his schedule so we can go and watch him play.

We hear every day the horror stories some children go thru. It is heartwarming to hear when things turn out right, the way we like to see them end.

# Yavapai CASA for Kids Foundation

## NAME CHANGE FOR CASA FOR KIDS

Yavapai CASA for Kids, Inc. has changed its name to the Yavapai CASA for Kids Foundation. The reason this name change was made is because people in the community often were confused by the difference between CASA for Kids and the actual CASA program itself. The board felt that the name change makes it clearer that our organization is the fundraising arm for the CASA program.

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## VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR CASA FOR KIDS FOUNDATION FUNDRAISER

The CASA for Kids Foundation needs additional funding support in order to carry out all the planned activities in 2013 to support children in foster care, youths in the ILS program, and CASA volunteers. Our normally scheduled August board meeting will be devoted to describing the event the fundraising committee is envisioning and to recruiting volunteers for the various tasks that will need to be completed. Some of these tasks may be quite time-consuming, while others will be considerably less so. Also, the more volunteers we have, the less each individual person will need to do.

This meeting will take place on **Thursday, August 8th, at 9 AM**, in the Juvenile Justice Center. We hope that as many CASAs as possible will attend this meeting and sign up for a task. Also, to be as successful as possible, we need other volunteers in the community. So if you have a friend or neighbor who might like to lend a hand, please feel free to bring him/her.

The 2013 CASA for Kids Foundation budget is the highest it's ever been -- more than \$100,000. Of this, approximately 90 - 95% goes directly to the children and to the CASA volunteers. Please consider supporting us in our efforts to raise as much money as possible.

# time for teens

- Time 4 Teens has been very busy these past months. We are preparing for a training on October 25 on “Child and Youth Sex Trafficking.” If you are shocked to think that this is an issue here in our “Home Town” we have news for you! Mark your calendars and register now for October 25<sup>th</sup> by contacting Quinci at 928-771-3165. We have an informative group of speakers who will broaden your understanding of what Trafficking is.
- Eileen Bond has accepted the vice chair for Time 4 Teens. I welcome her wealth of knowledge and wonderful sense of humor. She will help Myla keep Time 4 Teens going during my leave of absence, to which both Myla and I are grateful.
- Our team has also been working on a project with WYGC, “Improving the Quality and Degree of Child and Adolescent Involvement in their CFT’s.” Eileen and I brought the topic of the “voice of the child at a CFT” to the T4T team and then took it to WYGC. The Guidance Clinic conducted a survey of facilitators and therapists who work with children and identified a number of barriers to children’s effective participation in CFTs. They then developed a “Potential Solutions Work Sheet” that the T4T team have been working on. We would like CASA input. The Solutions Work Sheet will be e-mailed to CASAs to fill out and e-mail back to Quinci and given to the team. Now is the time for you to speak up and get things changed at CFT’s so please take the time to reflect on your experience, think about the problems and give us any solutions you may think of. We will put it all together and present our ideas back to the Clinic – hopefully by mid-August.
- Bob Sherman is working on a “Time 4 Teens Quick Reference” Binder for the CASA front office. This will contain printed articles or web sites pertaining to teens that CASA’s can take. - Many Thanks to Gay Lockling, Kathy Wombacher, Kathy Rhodes and Pat Robison for all the work they did breaking down the, “Motivational Interviewing” training for CASAs. I had been trying to take this training for years because I felt it would be a great tool to have working with teens who sometimes close you off the moment you open your mouth with that first question. I learned so much from this team of fun instructors. I would suggest that every take this training or that it be a yearly CASA training. It taught me to listen better, use open questions effectively, give affirmations and to watch for that subtle change. I asked several of the other CASAs that took the training to share their comments too. Here’s what some of them had to say:

**“Motivational Interviewing was very interactive and engaging. It provided useful communicative tools that will aid the CASA in obtaining information and helping others develop their own intrinsic values. This should be required training.”**

**“What I learned from this MI class is so important to the CASA work that we do every day. Just because I’ve been doing this for several years, it didn’t mean that I couldn’t learn something new. I highly recommend this class to all soon to be or newly appointed CASAs as well as all seasoned CASAs. Gay Lockling and her probation officer associates taught us so much about ourselves and the capabilities that we have at our disposal with MI. “**

Studies have shown that youth who have a healthy racial and cultural identity are more resilient and able to cope with their experiences better. Therefore, there is less depression, teen pregnancy and drug abuse. The Knowing Who You Are Training is being presented throughout Arizona. Trainees have included Judges, CASA's, CPS case managers, Foster Care Providers and FCRB members. Please see the flyer on page 16 for more details.




### What will I learn?

Knowing Who You Are is an interactive learning space for exploring racial and ethnic identity. You'll discover:

- Ideas for helping youth in foster care achieve a positive and healthy sense of racial and ethnic identity.
- Opportunities to investigate the impact of stereotypes, messages, and social influences on your own racial and ethnic identity.
- Data about the impact of institutional racism on various racial and ethnic groups.
- Strategies for addressing racism in your personal and professional life.

### Enlighten, Empower and Energize! Helping youth in care

We hope that a discussion will serve as a catalyst to:

- Begin developing a common framework for learning about racial and ethnic identity formation and, in particular, its impact on youth in out-of-home care.
- Open a healthy dialogue about racial and ethnic identity formation.
- Promote conversations related to topics that previously may have been ignored or considered uncomfortable.
- Illustrate some of the overt and subtle ways that prejudice and racism undermine an individual's sense of self.
- Underscore the particular challenges faced by youth in care, who are often disconnected from those who might help them to address and work through these devastating realities.
- Initiate discussion about the role that individuals and organizations, particularly social workers and others in the child welfare system, can play in supporting the development of healthy racial and ethnic identity formation for youth in care.
