The Commission on Judicial Conduct reviewed the incident reported by the judge and found no misconduct. The judge, upon learning that a picture showing him with the campaign supporters of another public official might be published, immediately notified the commission and provided a copy of the article which demonstrated that the judge's face was almost indistinguishable in the photograph. The judge realized that the photograph might imply that he supported the campaign of another public official, which is prohibited by the Code of Judicial Conduct.

The complaint is dismissed pursuant to Rule 16(a).

The picture of me is probably a violation of Canon 5A(1) (b) of the Code of Judicial Conduct. it was suggested during my conversation with your staff that I write the newspaper, telling them that no public endorsement was intended, which is true. However, since my name is not mentioned in the caption and the picture of me is unrecognizable, it seems to me that it might be best to leave well enough alone. Please advise.

In so far if possible, I will avoid having my picture taken in any future situations of this nature.
