I'm writing this note to explain, and expose an injustice occurring in [redacted] County, Arizona. I also fear for my physical safety, and want this information exposed should something happen to me.

Divorce is usually a private matter; I certainly wish mine could be. I believe the behavior of the officials involved in my case has been so outrageous I am forced to make my divorce a public issue.

I am a legal resident of [redacted] My ex- wife is a resident of Arizona. I had hoped we could resolve any disagreements through mediation. My wife however filed for divorce in Arizona, nearly [redacted] years ago. In Arizona, the divorcing couple should divide assets equally. Our estate is large enough that half of our net worth is enough for each of us to be comfortably retired. I planned to begin a second career. It appears to me that the size and liquid nature of our estate has generated a fee," feeding frenzy." To date in excess of \$1,000,000.00, has been spent on "professional fees." There is no rational reason why this should be allowed to take place. My complaint is easily verifiable, and I am prepared to do so.

The inexplicable waste of my family's money has enabled attorneys, and accountants to enrich themselves. The fact that I was not raised in [redacted] County, or that I'm one of the few [redacted] in the county, should not prohibit me from fair treatment. Unfortunately fairness has been absent throughout this entire ordeal. Judicial integrity in [redacted] County has also been compromised.

Today I have officially, lodged a complaint with The Arizona Bar, The Commission on Judicial Conduct, and the United States Department of Justice.

I wish this divorce were not necessary, but it is. I wish Lawyers, accountants, and judges would be honest. Here in [redacted] AZ. It appears they are not.
