Dear Judge Brammer:

It has come to my attention that without my knowledge or permission, my name appeared on campaign material for congressional candidate [redacted] in violation of Canon 5. I am unable to attach or direct you to the campaign release. The judge who actually provided me with the information was not sure whether he saw this in a newspaper or TV ad.

At no time did I give my permission to [redacted] or any of his staff to use my name or my title for any purpose, political or otherwise.

I immediately sent an email message to the candidate requesting the removal of my name from any political material I may be listed on.

As soon as I was made aware of this, I contacted Keith Stott who recommended that I send this letter to you.
