Judge unethical delays practices by not rendering judgment in case no. in favor of Plaintiff as prescribed by law, and not following the rules set forth in the Arizona Rules of Civil Procedure pertaining to default pleading and complaint pleading had caused Plaintiff to be denied the rights to sale his court judgment to potential buyer in violation of FIFTH, SIXTH, and FOURTEENTH amendments to the United States constitutions.
