Gentlemen:

A summary of my complaint is as follows:

- 1. On I received a traffic ticket on in the vicinity of
- 2. I had initially planned to dispute the ticket since there was no posted 55 mph speed limit on that particular stretch of that I had traveled (the last posted limit was 65 mph). However, since my primary residence is and that I would not be in the area on the stated court date of I sought a continuance for a date between when I would be visiting my Arizona vacation home.

- When I attempted to reschedule during early Judge court clerk was uncooperative and refused to accommodate my scheduling requirements. So, I was forced to subsequently plead no contest to the ticket and paid a fine via mail.
- 4. Had I been allowed the courtesy of a court date within my requested timeframe, I had photographic evidence to challenge the ticket. Although this is not the primary focus of my complaint with this Court, it does provide insight to the Court's lack of proper decorum, and as an extension, Judge judicial behavior.
- 5. During I received correspondence from the Judge court that my fine was rather than the amount and that an additional must be paid to the court for the fine and a late fee). After learning that I had misread the fine schedule, I subsequently paid the additional amount.
- 6. Despite having paid the required amount, I have continued to receive correspondence from Judge court clerk demanding additional sums of money The latest letters were dated These letters have included the following threats:
 - a. Suspension of my driver's license (although I do not possess an Arizona license)
 - b. A warrant for my arrest
 - c. Reporting of negative information to credit bureaus
- I have refused to pay the attempted extortion perpetrated by Judge clerk and have provided documentation to the Court challenging their demands.
- 8. Judge has clearly failed to properly supervise the activities of his subordinates.
 - Accordingly, his neglect has allowed these individuals to abuse their position within the court.
