COMPLAINT

I a family friend of helped file a complaint with the superior court. With this filing we filed an emergency order to take possession of a child who is in the possession of the father. On May 7th, the boyfriend of took her child and stole her money, ID, bag, and everything in it. He took the child and was nowhere to be found. After contacting us a detective informed us that we had to locate him. At which time we searched near and far and after no avail became frustrated. We received a call from him threatening the life of the child and threatening her with harm. He has a bad history of drugs, alcohol and domestic violence. The next day we went to court to file the emergency order of custody. Indicating that this person is violent and has addictions that are harmful to the child. We also informed the court that this man is a transit and we do not know where the child is. Our paperwork was taken but the judge never saw us or heard us. He denied the order. His clerk was very rude and cold and pushed us away, When I asked her a question she would respond very rudely "Sir, I am not talking to you." I was quiet until she said, "Oh well." What kind of justice is this? What kind of judge would not take the time to figure out what is going on?!?! Is this the judicial system we live in? We are informing you that this judge's conduct is not protecting the public or the child. If this child gets hurt the Superior Court and its affiliates will be responsible for this action. The State has a duty to protect the child when in danger.
