## TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

You will find enclosed a list of hours for the last three years that Justice of the Peace , worked in County while he was being paid as a Justice of the Peace in County. It is our understanding that the Commission has previously sanctioned him for a similar violation. While the County Courts would not provide the specific hours of the day the work was performed, Judge is regularly absent from his court on Fridays.

Because we are subject to the possibility of reprisal, we can not reveal our names, but we desire the Commission to investigate this stuation. We believe both Judge and the Presiding Judge of County who is knowingly employing him during hours he should be on the bench in County are in violation of the Canons of Judicial Ethics.

If an investigation is not started, we will turn this information over to the media along with proof that it was provided to you and no action was taken.
