On September 3, 2009, I filed a Notice of Change of Judge in the above mentioned newly filed quiet title action in Pinal County Superior Court. *See attached Notice of Change of Judge.*

Rather than allowing the pre-emptive strike, Judge referred the notice to Judge with a four paragraph narrative with blatantly biased and incorrect information, prejudicing me within the entire Pinal County court system. *See attached Notice from Judge 9/8/09.*

As a result of Judge active role in advocating against my Notice of Change by intimating that I gave notice for improper and frivolous purposes, that the merits of my claim to easement rights are somehow less than creditable, and attempts to link my notice with another case being litigated before him in which I am not a party.
