## **ORDER**

After reviewing the complaint, the recording of the hearing, and the judge's response, the commission finds that the judge's conduct in this case violated the Code of Judicial Conduct. During the hearing described in the complaint, the judge loudly spoke to the complainant in a sharp, rude manner and threatened him with contempt and arrest. Rule 2.8 of the code requires that a judge be patient, dignified and courteous to litigants. The conduct is unacceptable and inconsistent with the canons.

Accordingly, the judge is hereby reprimanded for his conduct pursuant to Rule 17(a), and the record in this case, consisting of the complaint, the judge's response and this order, shall be made public as required by Rule 9(a).
