The complainant alleged that a pro tem judge running for justice of the peace engaged in improper campaign activity by posting a misleading photograph on a website. After considering the complaint and the judge's response, the commission decided to dismiss the case with a private warning reminding the judge to comply with Rule 4.3 (C), (D), and (F) of the Code of Judicial Conduct, which governs campaign standards and communications. The complaint is dismissed pursuant to Rules 16(b) and 23.
