ORDER

The complainant, who is a court clerk, alleged that a justice of the peace yelled at court staff in front of the public counter, was routinely absent from the court for personal matters, and caused a backlog of cases because of time spent away from the court After analyzing the allegations, the judge's response, and letters from court staff supporting the response, the commission found no misconduct on the part of the judge. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.

March 17, 2010

On this date at around 11:55 am to 12:00 pm Judge yelled loudly at myself and a fellow co-worker named in front of the public at the counters of the courthouse and Court staff present at that timethe remaining Judge had a lunch meeting with a person I did not recognize as having court business with our court. Judge did not tell my direct supervisor or the Court Manager about this meeting so he could leave for lunch earlier than his usual 12:30 pm lunch time. The supervisors always let the clerks know what is going on with Judge as far as his meetings go and when he needs to get to lunch. On Wednesday mornings and myself process criminal misdemeanor cases and plea agreements. We type up the plea paper work and motions and get them into the judge in the courtroom every Wednesday morning. came out of his courtroom around the above time frame and proceeded to vell Judge rather loudly at us. He said "All right, SOMEBODY get over here NOW and help process these plea agreements RIGHT NOW !!!" He then went up to the court's counter and talked with his lunch appointment who was waiting in the lobby for him. There were only two or three remaining plea agreements to get the paperwork ready for Judge at this time. We ended up getting these pleas to him as soon as we could after this incident for fear of losing our jobs. Judge exhibited uncomfortable behavior toward me and . He was extremely Red-Faced and made physical movements toward both of our cubicles that I thought was very threatening to us both. These actions are in direct violation of The Code of Judicial Conduct Canons 1, 3, and 4. This series of events has caused myself extreme stress and discomfort while working on these criminal cases and plea agreements as part of my duties as a judicial clerk in his court. Judge has the sole authority to fire any member of his court staff and has done so several times in the past few years.

Judge would be the one to confirm or deny he made this statement to anyone. But I heard this going around the clerical area on July 28, 2010. Only Judge can provide his true whereabouts on these two days but I do not find it funny that other Justices of the Peace in the same building are making such statements that make it around to all the court clerks in the

Regional Center. Judge has had a lot of meetings over the last several years and this statement makes me as one on his court clerks wonder if he is really going to these meetings or taking care of personal non-court related business. A further inquiry into this incident is needed.

July 28, 2010

In the morning on these two days Judge had at least 100 cases waiting for him to sign or rule on pending motions before the court. These motions are put into several baskets on a long table in the back for the Judge to sit down at and sign. Over the past two years Judge has been extremely inconsistent in signing or ruling on these court files. The litigants of the court call multiple times weekly and sometimes monthly to see if Judge has looked at their file(s). Once I put my files in the basket for Judge to take care of he gets them back to me in a 4 to 6 to 8 week time frame. All the clerical staff of the Justice Court know that Judge is rarely at court available to sign or work on his baskets. and

know about this issue as well. This issue has still not been fully addressed by anyone. It is now court policy that we have to bring urgent file matters to attention for the Judge to sign or rule on because he is gone so frequently. Clerks will get written up for not abiding by the policy because the Judge is not taking care of all of his duties as Justice of the Peace. The Justice Court is the highest filing Justice Court in Maricopa County for the last two years. There are statistics on court reports that prove this fact. As such is the case Judge

should at a minimum be available to sign or rule on files on a weekly or bi-weekly basis. It is unfair to put this burden on the Pro-Tem Judges who visit our court to clear up the mess of files sitting on his judicial signing desk. A violation of Judicial Canons 3 and 4 should be looked into for this issue. On this day at about 12:00 pm I took a picture on my cell phone of the files he had signed on July 27 and July 28 before he went to his meetings those mornings. This picture shows two rather highly stacked piles of files signed by Judge To me this shows a non-diligent effort by Judge to take care of ALL of his Judicial Duties as the elected Justice of the Peace in the Justice Court. If the piles of files waiting to be distributed and processed by the clerks and the piles of files waiting to be signed by the Judge both are ridiculously high and spilling over the top of clerks cubicles—something is very wrong! know about or witnessed me taking this cell phone
