**ORDER**

The complainant alleged that a superior court judge and his staff were discourteous and unhelpful in his efforts to obtain guidance for completing service of process involving a person who appeared to be dead. After reviewing the complaint and the judge's response, the commission found no evidence of ethical misconduct on the part of the judge. Whether service of process was sufficient in this case is a legal issue outside the jurisdiction of the commission. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.
