ORDER

The complainant alleged that two superior court judges and a superior court commissioner ignored his efforts to enforce a restitution order in a criminal case.

The responsibility of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine if the judges and/or the commissioner engaged in conduct that violated the provisions of Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution or the Code of Judicial Conduct and, if so, to take appropriate disciplinary action. The purpose and authority of the commission is limited to this mission.

After review, the commission found no evidence of ethical misconduct and concluded that the judges and the commissioner did not violate the Code in this case. The commission does not have jurisdiction to review the legal sufficiency of the judicial officers' rulings. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety, pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.
