## ORDER

The complainant alleged a superior court judge violated several provisions of the Code of Judicial Conduct in connection with her re-election campaign.

The responsibility of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine if the judge engaged in conduct that violated the provisions of Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution or the Code of Judicial Conduct and, if so, to take appropriate disciplinary action. The purpose and authority of the commission is limited to this mission.

After review, the commission found no evidence of ethical misconduct and concluded that the judge did not violate the Code in this case. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety, pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.

As such, Judge is in violation of A.R.S. § 11-410.A which states in pertinent part "A county shall not spend or use its resources, including the use or expenditure of monies, accounts, credit, facilities, vehicles, postage, telecommunications, computer hardware and software, web pages, personnel, equipment, materials, buildings or any other thing of value, for the purpose of influencing the outcomes of elections."

Rule 1.1 of the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct requires a judge to "comply with the law, including the code of judicial conduct."

Rule 1.2 of the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct requires that "a judge shall act at all times in a manner that promotes public confidence in the independence, integrity, and impartiality of the judiciary, and shall avoid impropriety, and the appearance of impropriety."

The Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct, Canon 4, states a judge or candidate for judicial office shall not engage in political or campaign activity that is inconsistent with the independence, integrity, or impartiality of the judiciary. Specifically, Rule 4.1(A)(8) states "[a] judge or a judicial candidate shall not ... use court staff, facilities, or other court resources in a campaign for judicial office[.]"
