# ORDER

The complainant alleged a justice of the peace was prejudiced against him and made improper rulings in a criminal case.

The responsibility of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine if the judge engaged in conduct that violated the provisions of Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution or the Code of Judicial Conduct and, if so, to take appropriate disciplinary action. The purpose and authority of the commission is limited to this mission.

The commission does not have jurisdiction to review the legal sufficiency of the judge's rulings. In addition, the commission found no evidence of ethical misconduct and concluded that the judge did not violate the Code in this case. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety, pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Everyone was looking straight ahead when I exited the court room. I feel judge is predicted against me for I am white and every litigant was Hispanic and he also. I have also noticed hostility against me before with much rudeness directed towards me. I feel very uncomfortable with him and I want another judge who would treat me fairly. This is one of the most times in my new life and at my age. I want my Miranda Rights to be respected to and be respected by the courts. These charges should be dropped immediately.
