The complainant alleged a justice of the peace improperly endorsed a candidate for office.

The responsibility of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine if the justice of the peace engaged in conduct that violated the provisions of Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution or the Code of Judicial Conduct and, if so, to take appropriate disciplinary action. The purpose and authority of the commission is limited to this mission.

After review, the commission found no evidence of ethical misconduct and concluded that the justice of the peace did not violate the Code in this case. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety, pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

I am submitting this complaint regarding the activities of Judge Justice of the Peace It should be noted Judge is this year

On at approximately Judge wife, posted on her Facebook page, on behalf of her husband, an endorsement for a Candidate for Justice of the Peace, Included in this complaint is a screen shot of the event and the posting. In addition, on at approximately shared this post with others, including the posting of this information on Facebook page. A screen shot of the incident is also attached.

This Facebook posting and subsequent sharing of the post violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct by a Judge. Specifically Canon 4.1 (A3) and 4.1 (B) which states, " A judge or judicial candidate shall take reasonable measures to ensure that other persons do not undertake, on behalf of the judge or judicial candidate, any activities prohibited under paragraph (A)". Judge and his wife reside in the same residence and have been married for years and it is assumable they share intimate details of their personal lives and interactions to include social media. Judge is aware, or should have been aware of his wife's posting and the violation of the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct.

As a result of posting on Facebook. Judge has endorsed a candidate for Justice of the Peace in which is a violation. In addition, I have filed a complaint against candidate for this position, and I would ask the commission to review the information contained in that complaint, specifically the information regarding Judge and his endorsement.
