Judge Clancy E. Jayne, Respondent, through his attorney, David P. Brooks, and April P. Elliott, Disciplinary Counsel for the Commission on Judicial Conduct (“Commission”), hereby submit the following proposed resolution of these cases to the hearing panel pursuant to Rule 30 of the Commission Rules.

JURISDICTION

1. The Commission has jurisdiction over these matters pursuant to Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution.

2. Respondent began his service as a justice of the peace in Maricopa County, Arizona in 2009, and he served in that capacity at all times relevant to the allegations contained herein. Respondent lost his bid for re-election and his term as justice of the peace expired effective January 1, 2017.

3. As a justice of the peace when the alleged misconduct occurred and when the Commission's Statement of Charges was filed, Respondent was and is subject to the Code of Judicial Conduct ("Code") as set forth in Arizona Supreme Court Rule 81.

BACKGROUND

4. On August 24, 2016, Disciplinary Counsel filed a formal Statement of Charges against Respondent after a duly appointed investigative panel found reasonable cause to commence formal proceedings. After being granted leave to do so, Disciplinary Counsel filed an Amended Statement of Charges on October 19, 2016. Respondent filed his Response to the Amended Statement of Charges on November 2, 2016.

5. Disciplinary Counsel has disclosed to Respondent and his counsel that two other matters are pending before the Commission, the case numbers of which have been provided to Respondent, and that Disciplinary Counsel did not include these cases in the Commission's Amended Statement of Charges. Respondent has previously been provided with notice of the allegations of these cases, and has had an opportunity to respond in writing to the Commission regarding these allegations. Disciplinary Counsel avows that she had planned to recommend to the Commission the dismissal of those complaints with advisory comments to the Respondent pertaining to the implementation of procedural improvements, such as a better calendaring system. The parties acknowledge such suggestions for improvements are moot in light of Respondent losing his re-election bid in the primary election held on August 30, 2016.

MUTUAL CONSIDERATION

6. Other than what he has already stated in his Response to the Amended Statement of Charges, Respondent makes no admissions to the factual allegations contained in the Amended Statement of Charges nor any admissions that those facts violated the cited rules of the Code.

7. The parties agree that resolving this matter by stipulation is in their mutual best interests and in the best interests of the judicial system and the public.

AGREED UPON DISPOSITION

8. Respondent agrees not to seek or accept a judicial appointment of any type, not to run for an elective judicial office, or serve in any judicial capacity¹ in the State of Arizona at any time on and after the date he signs this agreement.

9. Respondent specifically acknowledges this stipulated resolution does not deal with or resolve complaints raising allegations not already a part of an open Commission case or investigation as of the date this stipulation is signed by Respondent.

10. The Commission shall make no findings of fact or conclusions of law regarding the allegations set forth in the Amended Statement of Charges. Upon

¹ The parties agree that not serving in any judicial capacity encompasses the definition of "Judge" in the Code of Judicial Conduct, which states: "Judge" means any person who is authorized to perform judicial functions within the Arizona judiciary, including a justice or judge of a court of record, a justice of the peace, magistrate, court commissioner, special master, hearing officer, referee, or pro tempore judge.

execution of this agreement, the Commission shall close Case Nos. 14-319, 16-192, 16-195, and 16-248. These charges shall not be refiled unless this agreement is breached by Respondent as further outlined in paragraph 14.

11. The Commission further agrees that upon execution of this agreement, the cases referred to in paragraph 5 shall be closed as moot. The Commission's executive director shall issue dispositional orders in these cases. When these cases are posted to the Commission's website, all identifying information will be redacted. The cases referred to in paragraph 5 will not be brought or pursued again by the Commission unless Respondent breaches the terms and conditions of this agreement as outlined in paragraph 14.

12. Disciplinary Counsel acknowledges Respondent and his counsel's cooperation with the Commission in the negotiation of this stipulated resolution.

OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS

13. This agreement, if accepted by the hearing panel, fully resolves all issues raised in the Commission's Amended Statement of Charges and the cases referred to in paragraph 5, and fully resolves any complaints against Respondent, whether pending or not, that arise out of or relate to the facts contained in those matters. This agreement may be used as evidence in later proceedings in accordance with the Commission's Rules. If the hearing panel does not accept this agreement as a full resolution of the foregoing matters, the parties can either re-negotiate the terms and conditions to address the concerns raised by the hearing panel, or if further

negotiations are not successful, the matters will be set for hearing without any use of this agreement.

14. In the event Respondent fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this agreement by seeking appointment or election to a judicial office or serving as a judge in Arizona, the Commission may reinstate the Amended Statement of Charges, and may pursue charges in the cases referred to in paragraph 5, by giving Respondent written notice of its intention to do so, and the matters will proceed to hearing pursuant to the Commission's rules. Respondent waives any and all claims concerning delay or other irregularities in the Commission so doing.

15. In the event Respondent fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this agreement by seeking appointment or election to a judicial office or serving as a judge in Arizona, the Commission may also seek injunctive relief enjoining Respondent from engaging in conduct in breach of the terms and conditions of this agreement.

16. Both parties waive their right to seek review of the hearing panel's decision concerning the approval of this agreement, including the appeal procedures set out in Commission Rule 29.

17. Both parties agree that the Stipulated Resolution and Order shall be public documents upon the acceptance of the Stipulated Resolution and the approval of the Order by the hearing panel.

18. Both parties will pay their own costs and attorney's fees associated with this matter.

19. Respondent understands the terms and conditions of this agreement, has reviewed them with his legal counsel, and fully agrees to and will abide by them.

20. This agreement constitutes the complete understanding between the parties.

An investigative panel of the Commission on Judicial Conduct (Commission) determined that there is reasonable cause to commence formal proceedings against Judge Clancy E. Jayne (Respondent) for misconduct in office. This statement of charges sets forth the Commission's jurisdiction and specifies the nature of the alleged misconduct.

JURISDICTION

1. The Commission has jurisdiction of this matter pursuant to Article 6.1, § 4 of the Arizona Constitution and the Rules of the Commission.
2. This Statement of Charges is filed pursuant to Rule 24(a) of those rules (Commission Rules).
3. Respondent has served as a justice of the peace in Maricopa County since January 2009, and continues to hold that position although he lost his primary election in August 2016, and his term will expire at the end of 2016. He was serving in his capacity as a judge at all times relevant to these allegations.

4. As a judge, Respondent is subject to the 2009 Code of Judicial Conduct (Code) as set forth in Supreme Court Rule 81.

PRIOR DISCIPLINE

5. Closed files pertaining to discipline of Respondent may be referred to and used by the Commission or by Respondent for the purpose of determining the severity of the sanction, a pattern of misconduct, or exoneration of the judge pursuant to Commission Rule 22(e).

6. Consistent with the requirements of Commission Rule 22(e), undersigned Disciplinary Counsel (Counsel) notified Respondent on August 18, 2016, that his prior disciplinary history, as set forth below, may be so used.

Case No. 2014-055, Public Warning

7. Several anonymous complaints alleged that Respondent engaged in improper conduct in soliciting sponsors for a radio show and engaging in other self-promotional activity.

8. While the Commission found that there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct, it approved sending the judge a warning letter, and authorized it to be public pursuant to Commission Rule 9(c). The Commission expressed its concern to Respondent that he failed to remove a solicitation for sponsors for his radio show on his website more than two months after he agreed to do so, and gave him a deadline of August 31, 2014, to do so. The Commission also warned Respondent that his "Ask Judge Jayne Anything" feature on his webpages was ripe for violating Rules 1.2 and 2.9, as open solicitations for communication could give rise to solicitations for legal advice and improper ex parte communications. He was encouraged to either remove the broad-based invitation or post a specific disclaimer that he cannot provide legal advice or engage in ex parte communications on pending or impending cases.

Case No. 2013-280, Private Warning

9. The Commission opened an investigation to review allegations that Respondent was biased, improperly provided his personal contact information to jurors, and inappropriately solicited ex parte communications from jurors.

10. The Commission issued Respondent a private warning letter, expressing concern that inviting jurors to personally contact him amounted to a solicitation of improper ex parte communication, and that his practice of meeting with an empaneled jury privately could give rise to the appearance of impropriety.

Case No. 2013-150, Public Reprimand

11. An anonymous complainant alleged that Respondent improperly allowed one of his campaign contributors to serve as a representative of a relative during a mediation scheduled before Respondent. Respondent improperly granted this request even though the individual was not an attorney and was not legally permitted to serve as another party's representative in a legal proceeding.

12. The Commission found Respondent violated Rules 1.1, 2.2, and 2.11(A) of the Code of Judicial Conduct.

13. In reaching its decision, the Commission noted Respondent had received direct education on this legal issue at least twice, and he should have disqualified himself from making any rulings in the underlying case given his relationship with a party, as Rule 2.11(A) requires a judge to disqualify himself "in any proceeding in which the judge's impartiality might reasonably be questioned."

Case No. 2012-156, Private Warning

14. The complainant alleged that Respondent improperly collected petition signatures for himself and other candidates at one of his "Breakfast with the Judge" events.

15. The Commission issued a private warning, citing concerns that Respondent's conduct potentially violated Rules 4.1(A)(1), 4.1(A)(2), and 4.1(A)(5), if he spoke publicly in support of another political candidate by encouraging others to sign their petitions.

Case No. 2012-104, Public Reprimand/Private Warning

16. An anonymous complainant alerted the Commission that Respondent's personal website continued to improperly advertise wedding services, despite his previous discipline for that conduct. The complainant also alleged that Respondent's website improperly listed corporate sponsors, including companies that provided services to the court, and invited improper ex parte communications.

17. The Commission found that Respondent had previously been reprimanded for violating Rule 3.16(C) of the Code in Case No. 2011-155, by advertising wedding services, and advised that a continued reference to an ongoing personal business would violate Rule 1.3 of the Code. Despite this sanction, Respondent failed to ensure that those issues on his website were resolved, and the Commission issued another reprimand. The Commission further ordered Respondent to obtain a mentor to address concerns related to his personal website, finding that Respondent lacked sufficient sensitivity to the Code's direction on permissible activities, the appearance of impropriety, and his use of the internet.

18. Additionally, the Commission sent a private warning letter to Respondent on other matters raised in the complaint. Specifically, the Commission warned Respondent that engaging corporate sponsors on his website and to sponsor his "Breakfast with the Judge" events may be a violation of Rules 1.3, 2.4, 3.12, and/or 3.13 of the Code. The Commission also advised Respondent that he was a judge at all times, and all of his outside activities must comply with the Code.

Case No. 2011-159, Public Reprimand

19. The complainant alleged Respondent engaged in improper ex parte communications with a defendant, and improperly handled the matter. The complainant believed Respondent had a personal or political relationship with the defendant.

20. The Commission determined Respondent engaged in several ex parte communications that clearly violated Rule 2.9 of the Code. In particular, Respondent believed that his communications only pertained to scheduling matters, however, he

failed to disclose them as required by Rule 2.9(A)(1)(b). The Commission noted additional concern due to the personal nature of the communications, including the fact that at least one communication occurred through the use of the judge's private email address.

Case No. 2011-155, Public Reprimand, Private Warning and Advisory

21. The Commission initiated an investigation regarding Respondent's "Breakfast with the Judge" events, and information on his personal website pertaining to wedding services, his personal consulting business, and a list of "local resources." The Commission reached three distinct resolutions on these intertwined issues.

22. The Commission issued a warning letter to Respondent regarding his "Breakfast with the Judge" events. The Commission found the events were advertised in overtly political contexts which may violate Rule 1.2 of the Code. The Commission also warned that hosting political speakers, all of whom are candidates for public office and from the same party, may violate Rules 3.1(C) and 4.1(A)(3).

23. Respondent also received an advisory letter recommending that the "local resources" on his website not provide links to any major political party so as to avoid the appearance that he was subject to political influence. The Commission also recommended Respondent remove the reference on his personal/campaign website to his on-going work for a private financial services company, as it potentially violated Rule 1.3, which forbids using the prestige of judicial office to advance personal or economic interests.

24. The Commission reprimanded Respondent for advertising his wedding services as a clear violation of Rule 3.16(C), finding that a reprimand was warranted since he had previously received an advisory letter on the same issue and was advised to discontinue the practice and had failed to do so.

Case No. 2011-050, Public Reprimand

25. The record demonstrated that Respondent engaged in numerous improper ex parte communications with the parties on one side of the underlying case, and Respondent acknowledged this in his response to the Commission. This conduct

substantially impacted the underlying case, and clearly violated Rule 2.9 of the Code. Respondent subsequently vacated his ruling, and a new judge was assigned to the case.

26. Although Respondent was new to the bench at the time the communications occurred, the Commission found that Respondent had completed all new judge training, including training on the Code that specifically related to ex parte communications. Therefore, the Commission found Respondent's ethical misconduct warranted a public reprimand.

Case No. 2009-035, Private Advisory

27. The Commission received a complaint alleging Respondent, then newly-elected, was advertising wedding services on his website. The Commission issued a private advisory to Respondent, reminding him that Canon 4(J)¹ of the Code prohibited a judge from advertising his/her ability to perform weddings.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

28. Respondent is currently a justice of the peace for the Desert Ridge Justice Court, Maricopa County, Arizona.

29. Respondent must stand for election every four years, and as part of his re-election campaign, Respondent has engaged in various campaign activities, and maintains websites and social media pages.

30. Respondent's website for his "Breakfast with the Judge" events is www.breakfastwiththejudge.com.

31. Respondent has periodically revised the content of his "Breakfast with the Judge" website, and for purposes of this complaint, the webpage, as it existed on October 31, 2014, is referred to as the 2014 Breakfast with the Judge page, and the webpage, as it existed on March 18, 2016, is referred to as the 2016 Breakfast with the Judge page.

32. Respondent's campaign related website is www.clancyjayne.com.

33. Respondent has periodically revised the content of his website, and for purposes of this complaint, the webpage, as it existed on October 31, 2014, is referred

¹ Under the current version of the Code, this section corresponds to Rule 3.16(C).

to as the 2014 webpage, and the webpage, as it existed on March 18, 2016, is referred to as the 2016 webpage. Using the web address www.jayne2016.com also directs a viewer to the 2016 webpage.

34. Respondent's Facebook page at all times is <https://www.facebook.com/clancy.jayne.52>.

Facts Regarding Respondent's use of Non-Public Information for Purposes Unrelated to Judicial Duties

35. On or about September 25, 2014, Respondent sent an invitation, via email, to his 65th birthday celebration to be held at Turf Paradise Race Course [Turf Paradise] in Phoenix, Arizona. The invitation clearly noted a silent auction fundraiser would be held. **Exhibit 1.**

36. Upon information and belief, Respondent sent this email from his campaign email address to multiple Maricopa County justices of the peace at their government email accounts issued by the Administrative Office of the Courts.

37. A judge's email address is non-public information.

38. In his December 2, 2014 written response [hereinafter December 2014 response] to the Commission, Respondent admitted he sent this invitation to a database that included Maricopa County justices of the peace and other judges throughout the state. Respondent further admitted that he only had government email addresses for some individuals in his database, claiming they had an option to opt out of receiving emails from him.

39. Also in his December 2014 response, Respondent admitted the beneficiary of the party and silent auction was his 2016 re-election campaign.

40. The purpose of the email invitation was to solicit individuals to attend the event and/or support his re-election effort, and was not in any way related to judicial duties.

**Facts Regarding Respondent's Direct Solicitation of Funds for his
Turf Paradise Birthday Party and
Misrepresentation of the Amount of Funds Raised**

41. Respondent held a 65th birthday party/fundraiser on November 22, 2014, at Turf Paradise. Tickets were \$50.00 per person. This event was advertised in multiple ways including via email (as noted in paragraph 35), on his Jayne 2016 webpage, and by postcards. **Exhibit 2.**

42. One flyer advertising the event stated: "Register now to get your tickets by ordering them online or filling out a form on paper that you can mail to the Judge directly." **Exhibit 3.**

43. After the birthday party, Respondent posted an update regarding the event on his website (**Exhibit 4**), making the following statements:

a. "Laughter, food and frivolity were the order of the day when more than 100 of our friends turned out to celebrate Judge Clancy Jayne's 65th birthday at Turf Paradise racetrack in North Phoenix on November 22."

b. "A silent auction showcasing some 50 items ranging from 'I want that!' to comic to 'what a deal!' added to the afternoon's festivities as attendees vied to write in the top bid for their desired merchandise, trips, event tickets or art."

c. "Noted Valley auctioneer Casey Jones concluded the bidding activity with a live auction that featured unique artistic golf putters and other novelty items that sparked hot and heavy bidding wars before the "Sold!" sound rang out."

d. "The silent and live auctions raised more than \$5,000.00 to kick off funding for Jayne 2016 Desert Ridge Justice of the Peace re-election campaign."

44. As a candidate for justice of the peace, Respondent is required to file periodic campaign finance reports with the Maricopa County Elections Department.

45. For the reporting period that covered from November 26, 2013 through December 31, 2014, Respondent reported no activity for Jayne 2016.

46. For the reporting period that covered January 1, 2014 through May 1, 2014, Respondent reported \$1,365.00 in contributions, including an \$800.00 candidate loan. No in-kind contributions were noted. The June 30th Report covering this time period was originally filed on June 30, 2014. A second June 30th Report, presumably amended although not labeled as such, was filed on October 28, 2014, which reduced the amount of expenditures claimed. **Exhibit 5.**

47. For the reporting periods of June 1, 2014 to August 14, 2014, and August 15, 2014 to September 15, 2014, Respondent reported no activity for Jayne 2016.

48. Respondent filed his Pre-General Election Report on October 27, 2014, which covered the time period of September 16, 2014 through October 23, 2014. An amended first page was filed on October 28, 2014, and reflected a correction in the amount of cash on hand from the prior report. The report noted \$1,537.61 in contributions ranging in date from September 18, 2014 to October 23, 2014. One in-kind contribution of a \$10.00 gift certificate is noted. No expenses for the purchase of auction items is noted. **Exhibit 6.**

49. On or about December 4, 2014, Respondent filed his Post-General Election Report which covers a time period between October 24, 2014 and November 24, 2014. The report notes \$475.00 in contributions ranging in date from October 23, 2014 to November 18, 2014, although his Schedule A only accounts for \$425.00 of these contributions. Schedule B to that report lists a generic \$1,567.00 for the November 22, 2014 event. No in-kind contributions are noted. No expenses for the purchase of auction items are noted. **Exhibit 7.**

50. On or about April 27, 2015, the Commission sent Respondent an email seeking additional information on the birthday party/fundraiser, including a request to clarify the discrepancy between the amount he claimed to have raised and the amounts actually showing on his campaign finance reports.

51. On or about May 18, 2015, Respondent sent the Commission an email stating, "While these are very simple to answer it has taken us to a level that requires much more of a response from my camp. We are preparing a written response to this."

52. On or about May 19, 2016, the Commission sent a letter to Respondent reminding him he had never submitted a written response, and again asking for clarification on the accuracy of his campaign finance reports.

53. On or about June 10, 2016, Respondent sent the Commission an email alleging the Commission had not complied with its rules pertaining to the initiation of an investigation.

54. On or about June 13, 2016, the Commission sent Respondent a letter advising the Commission had complied with Commission Rule 20 and had provided him with a written statement of the allegations constituting the complaint, and had given him notice and opportunity to respond.

55. In the June 13, 2016 letter, the Commission reminded Respondent of his obligations under Rule 2.16 of the Code, and advised his deadline to respond to these issues was June 30, 2016.

56. Respondent provided no additional information to the Commission on this issue by June 30, 2016.

Facts Regarding Continued Use of Corporate Sponsors

57. On July 9, 2012, in connection with Case No. 2012-104, the Commission sent a private warning letter to Respondent indicating having corporate sponsors on his website may violate Rules 1.3, 2.4, 3.12, and/or 3.13 of the Code.

58. On or about November 3, 2014, Respondent's 2014 Breakfast with the Judge webpage still had two corporate sponsors, specifically Deer Valley Airport Restaurant and Premier Southwest Planning Group, LLC. The webpage also contained a blank space that stated: "You Could Be Here. Sponsor Judge Clancy Today and be advertised on our sites."

59. The Breakfast with the Judge events are promoted using Judge Jayne's judicial title, and Judge Jayne does receive a material benefit from the fees collected from the tickets and any campaign merchandise sold at said events.

60. The 2016 Breakfast with the Judge webpage no longer contains corporate sponsors.

**Facts Supporting Direct Solicitation of Funds for
“Breakfast with the Judge” Events**

61. Respondent continued to hold “Breakfast with the Judge” events.

62. In connection with a “Breakfast with the Judge” event held on March 19, 2016, Respondent utilized both his 2016 Breakfast with the Judge webpage and his Facebook page to promote the event.

63. On November 16, 2015, Respondent posted an advertisement for the March 19, 2016, “Breakfast with the Judge” event on his Facebook page, which noted the ticket price of \$50.00 per person. The ad also stated: “As many of you know 2016 will hold a new election, with new candidates. Breakfast with the Judge is a great and fun way to assist in my efforts to become re-elected as Justice of the Peace of the Desert Ridge Precinct and to fully grasp my community concerns and commitments such as reducing DUIs and domestic violence.” **Exhibit 8.**

64. On January 28, 2016, Respondent made a post on his Facebook page with a different flyer for the March 19, 2016, “Breakfast with the Judge” event. His post stated: “Our breakfast event in March is filling up faster than anticipated, please don’t forget to purchase your tickets before we are sold out! I can’t wait to seed [sic] all of you.” **Exhibit 9.**

Facts Regarding Continued Open Ended Communications

65. In the public warning letter issued in Case No. 2014-055 sent on August 22, 2014, the Commission advised Respondent that his open solicitations for communication on his webpage implicated Rules 1.2 and 2.9 of the Code, by opening the door to solicitations for legal advice and improper ex parte communications. Respondent was urged to remove such broad-based language or post a disclaimer that he could not give legal advice or engage in ex parte communications concerning pending or impending cases that violates Rule 2.9 of the Code.

66. As of November 3, 2014, Respondent’s 2014 webpage still contained a feature called “Coffee with the Judge.” The feature stated: “You could have a nice chat

with the Judge! Arrange to have a neighborhood coffee chat with Clancy Jayne to have a casual chat. Click below to fill out a form to get started.”

67. As of November 3, 2014, under the “Contact” button of Respondent’s 2014 webpage, a feature appeared entitled “Ask Clancy Jayne Anything.” The feature further stated, “If you’ve got comments or questions you would like to send to Judge Clancy Jayne, you can get started by filling out the form below!”

68. On November 3, 2014, the Commission sent Respondent a letter advising him that he had not complied with the directives of the August 22, 2014 warning.

69. On December 2, 2014, Respondent sent a letter to the Commission advising that he would put a disclaimer on the “Coffee with the Judge” feature.

70. In a letter dated February 24, 2015, Respondent advised that the following disclaimer had been placed on his webpage: “The materials on this website are provided for information purposes only and do not constitute legal advice.”

71. Respondent’s 2016 webpage contains a “Let’s Chat” feature under “Contact” which invites the viewer to send Respondent a message. The page contains the disclaimer noted in Paragraph 70. There is no disclaimer about prohibited ex parte communications with the Judge.

72. Respondent’s 2016 “Breakfast with the Judge” webpage contains a “Get in Touch” feature under “Contact” which invites the viewer to send Respondent a message or question. The page contains the disclaimer noted in Paragraph 70. There is no disclaimer about prohibited ex parte communications.

**Facts Supporting Active Participation in Another’s Campaign and
Public Endorsement of Another Candidate for Public Office**

73. Respondent has a truck utilized for campaign purposes that he refers to as the “Big Rig.”

74. On October 22, 2015, Respondent posted a photo of the “Big Rig” on his Facebook page. The photo clearly shows a campaign sign for Representative Karen Fann on the roof. **Exhibit 10.**

Facts Concerning Public Statement on Pending and Impending Cases

75. Respondent's "Big Rig" is adorned with a large photo of himself and the messages of "Stop Domestic Violence," "Distracted Driving is Dangerous," and "DUI is Dangerous and Illegal."

76. As justice of the peace, Respondent's court handles cases of domestic violence, DUI, and distracted driving that occur within the court's jurisdictional boundaries.

Facts Regarding the Sale of Shirts Bearing the Court's Name

77. Respondent's 2016 webpage allows an individual donating to Respondent's campaign to purchase a pink shirt for \$70.00. The shirt has a logo of a coyote and the moon and is embroidered with the words "Desert Ridge Justice Court."

78. The shirts do not say "elect" or "vote" for a particular candidate, but only bear the name of the court. A wearer of the shirt could be mistaken for an employee or someone affiliated with the court.

79. Respondent's 2016 "Breakfast with the Judge" webpage shows Respondent in photos with several individuals wearing the shirts, or holding the shirts on a hanger.

80. On May 19, 2016, the Commission sent a letter to Respondent regarding these shirts asking, among other questions, to identify the source of the funds used to purchase the shirts (personal, campaign, or court funds), and to advise if he believed the production and distribution of the shirts abused the prestige of office to advance his own interests.

81. On or about June 10, 2016, Respondent sent the Commission an email alleging the Commission had not complied with its rules pertaining to the initiation of an investigation.

82. On or about June 13, 2016, the Commission sent Respondent a letter advising the Commission had complied with Rule 20 and had provided him with a written statement of the allegations constituting the complaint, and had given him notice and opportunity to respond.

83. In the June 13, 2016 letter, the Commission reminded Respondent of his obligations under Rule 2.16 of the Code, and advised his deadline to respond to these issues was June 30, 2016.

84. Respondent provided no additional information to the Commission on this issue by June 30, 2016.

Facts Regarding Use of Old Campaign Signs with Outdated Endorsements

85. On or about July 2016, Respondent erected campaign signs in his precinct that he had originally used when he ran for the Arizona State House of Representatives.

86. While Respondent initially covered the prior office of House of Representatives with stickers, he failed to cover up those portions of the signs which contained endorsements from various organizations who endorsed his legislative candidacy. **Exhibit 11.**

87. Upon information and belief, all endorsements on his recycled signs were not valid for the 2016 election cycle.

88. One organization in particular, the Arizona Chamber of Commerce and Industry, specifically sent a cease and desist letter to Respondent to remove their logo and endorsement from all campaign materials. **Exhibit 12.**

89. Upon information and belief, Respondent later covered all outdated endorsements on his signs with stickers, and reported this matter to the Commission. **Exhibit 13.**

Facts Regarding Respondent's Statements Which Cast Doubt on his Temperament and Fitness to Serve as Judge

90. The August 25, 2016 edition of the *Yellow Sheet Report* contained an article which discussed Arizona Governor Doug Ducey's endorsement of Respondent's primary opponent, Cathy Riggs.

91. The article contains numerous quoted statements from Respondent in which he expressed his displeasure at Governor Ducey's actions. Such statements included:

a. "I've never been more disappointed, not because it has anything to do with the results of the election. It's [because] I've known that son of a bitch for 30 years. When he drove a beer truck for Hensley and Company, he was running around doing gofer work for me when I was president of Gilbert Days . . . He was having to go around and do gofer work for me because I got Jim Hensley to be our beer sponsor for the rodeo."

b. "Between him [Governor Ducey] and Kirk Adams and Mike Liburdi, these guys don't even understand that they're going to get an education. They are going to get an education, because I am beyond pissed. I am so pissed."

c. "You will figure it out. You will figure it out real soon. As long as I'm successful on Tuesday."

d. "The marketing that I'm going to be doing in the next three years is going to be incredible. They're going to get an education. It's what I was going to do anyway . . . They just don't understand. They don't understand."

e. [In reference to the Governor's Chief of Staff Kirk Adams] "He's been mad at me ever since. That stupid son of a bitch, his dad was my dad's insurance man. He doesn't even have a clue."

VIOLATIONS OF THE CODE OF JUDICIAL CONDUCT

92. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-40, violated Rule 3.5 of the Code which requires that a judge "shall not intentionally disclose or use non-public information acquired in a judicial capacity for any purpose unrelated to a judge's judicial duties."

93. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-40, also violated Rule 4.1(A)(8) of the Code which prohibits a judge from using "court staff, facilities, or other court resources in a campaign for judicial office."

94. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 41-42, violated Rule 4.1(A)(6) of the Code which states a judge shall not "personally solicit or accept campaign contributions other than through a campaign committee authorized by Rule 4.4."

95. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 41-56, violated Rule 4.2(A)(2) which requires judicial candidates to "comply with all applicable election, election campaign, and election campaign fund-raising laws and regulations."

96. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 41-56, also violated Rule 4.3(A) which states: "During the course of any campaign for nomination or election to judicial office, a judicial candidate, by means of campaign materials, including sample ballots, advertisements in the media, electronic communications, or a speech, press release, or any other public communication, shall not knowingly or with reckless disregard . . . post, publish, broadcast, transmit, circulate, or distribute information concerning the judicial candidate or an opponent that would be deceiving or misleading to a reasonable person."

97. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 41-56, also violated Rule 2.16(A) of the Code which states, "a judge shall cooperate and be candid and honest with judicial and lawyer disciplinary agencies."

98. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 57-60, violated Rule 1.3 of the Code which states, "a judge shall not abuse the prestige of judicial office to advance the personal or economic interests of the judge or others, or allow others to do so."

99. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 57-60, violated Rule 2.4(C) of the Code which states, "a judge shall not convey or permit others to convey the impression that any person or organization is in a position to influence the judge."

100. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 57-60, violated Rule 3.13(A) of the Code which states, "a judge shall not accept any gifts, loans, bequests, benefits, or other things of value, if acceptance is prohibited by law or would appear to a reasonable person to undermine the judge's independence, integrity, or impartiality."

101. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 61-64, violated Rule 4.1(A)(6) of the Code which states a judge shall not "personally solicit or

accept campaign contributions other than through a campaign committee authorized by Rule 4.4.”

102. Respondent’s conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 65-72, violated Rule 1.2 of the Code which requires a judge to act at all times “in a manner that promotes public confidence in the independence, integrity, and impartiality of the judiciary, and shall avoid impropriety and the appearance of impropriety.”

103. Respondent’s conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 73-74, violated Rule 4.1(A)(3) of the Code which states that a judge shall not “publicly endorse or oppose another candidate for any public office.”

104. Respondent’s conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 73-74, also violated Rule 4.1(A)(5) of the Code which prohibits a judge from “actively tak[ing] part in any political campaign other than his or her own campaign for election, reelection or retention in office.”

105. Respondent’s conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 75-76, violated Rule 2.10(A) of the Code which prohibits a judge from making “any public statement that might reasonably be expected to affect the outcome or impair the fairness of a matter pending or impending in any court.”

106. Respondent’s conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 75-76, also violated Rule 1.2 of the Code which requires a judge to act at all times “in a manner that promotes public confidence in the independence, integrity, and impartiality of the judiciary, and shall avoid impropriety and the appearance of impropriety.”

107. Respondent’s conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 77-84, violated Rule 1.3 of the Code which states, “a judge shall not abuse the prestige of judicial office to advance the personal or economic interests of the judge or others, or allow others to do so.”

108. Respondent’s conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 77-84, also violated Rule 2.16(A) of the Code which states, “a judge shall cooperate and be candid and honest with judicial and lawyer disciplinary agencies.”

109. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 85-89, violated Rule 4.2 of the Code which states: "(A) A judicial candidate shall: (1) act at all times in a manner consistent with the independence, integrity, and impartiality of the judiciary; (2) comply with all applicable election, election campaign, and election campaign fund-raising laws and regulations; (3) review and approve the content of all campaign statements and materials produced by the candidate or his or her campaign committee, as authorized by Rule 4.4, before their dissemination; and (4) take reasonable measures to ensure that other persons do not undertake on behalf of the candidate activities other than those described in Rule 4.4 that the candidate is prohibited from doing by Rule 4.1."

110. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-24, and 85-89, violated Rule 4.3 of Code, which states in pertinent part: "During the course of any campaign for nomination or election to judicial office, a judicial candidate, by means of campaign materials, including sample ballots, advertisements in the media, electronic communications, or a speech, press release, or any other public communication, shall not knowingly or with reckless disregard do any of the following: (A) Post, publish, broadcast, transmit, circulate, or distribute information concerning the judicial candidate or an opponent that would be deceiving or misleading to a reasonable person; . . . (F) Misrepresent the identity, qualifications, present position, or any other fact about the judicial candidate or an opponent; . . . (J) Falsely identify the source of a statement, issue statements under the name of another person without authorization, or falsely state the endorsement of or opposition to a judicial candidate by a person, organization, political party, or publication."

111. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 90-91, violated Rule 1.2 of the Code which requires a judge to act at all times "in a manner that promotes public confidence in the independence, integrity, and impartiality of the judiciary, and shall avoid impropriety and the appearance of impropriety."


112. Respondent's conduct, as described above in Paragraphs 28-34, and 90-91, violated Arizona Constitution, Article 6.1 Section 4, as "conduct prejudicial to the administration of justice that brings the judicial office into disrepute"

REQUESTED RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Disciplinary Counsel hereby requests that the Commission recommend to the Supreme Court that Respondent be censured, suspended, or removed from judicial office; that costs and attorney's fees be assessed against Respondent pursuant to Commission Rule 18(e); and that the court grant such other relief as it deems appropriate.

The Chamber's endorsement for a past candidacy is limited to that specific race and election cycle alone. Again, it is critical that you immediately remove any and all indicia of the Arizona Chamber of Commerce and Industry from your campaign materials.

17 **RESPONDENT'S RESPONSE TO**
18 **AMENDED STATEMENT OF CHARGES**

19 Respondent

20 Pursuant to Arizona Commission on Judicial Conduct Rule 25 ("Rules), Respondent
21 Judge Clancy E. Jayne responds to the Amended Statement of Charges as follows:

- 22 1. Respondent admits that, except as described below, the Arizona Commission on
23 Judicial Conduct ("Commission") has jurisdiction over this matter, but denies that
24 there is any basis for the Commission to discipline Respondent on the grounds as
25 noted in Arizona Constitution, Article 6.1, § 4 or otherwise.
- 26 2. Respondent admits the statement in paragraph 2 as phrased, but does not admit that
the Amended Statement of Charges (referred to herein as "Statement") should have
been brought or that there is sufficient reasonable cause to file or prosecute the
Statement.
3. As to paragraph 3, Respondent admits that he has served as a justice of the peace
since January 2009 and holds that position as of the date of filing this Response.

1 Further Respondent admits that his term will expire at the end of 2016. Respondent
2 does not waive the argument that this proceeding is, or may become, moot because he
3 will, or may, cease to be a judge as defined in the Rules or the Code.

4 4. Paragraph 4 states a legal conclusion to which no response is required. But
5 Respondent notes that the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct as reflected on the
6 Commission's website refers to rules that were "Effective September 1, 2009" and
7 "Amended November 24, 2009" so the broad allegation that Respondent is subject to
8 the "2009 Code of Judicial Conduct" (referred to herein as the "Code"), is not entirely
9 clear since the allegation is that Respondent took office in January 2009, meaning
10 there may be some period of time under which Respondent was not subject to the
11 2009 Code.

12 5. Paragraph 5 states a legal conclusion as framed by a Commission Rule, to which no
13 response is required.

14 6. Respondent admits the allegation in paragraph 6, but denies that the notice was timely
15 or sent consistent with Due Process.

16 7. Responding to paragraphs 7 through 27, Respondent admits that there have been prior
17 matters concerning him that have been brought before the Commission, but does not
18 admit to the characterization or description of the matters as alleged. The
19 Commission's records regarding these matters speak for themselves. Moreover,
20 Respondent does not concede that the listed matters are the proper subject of inclusion
21 in the present Statement or that the listed matters are relevant here. Finally,
22 Respondent reserves his right, pursuant to Rule 22(e) to "raise issues pertaining to
23 prior conduct in the[se] proceedings."

24 8. Respondent admits the allegations in paragraph 28.

25 9. Respondent denies the allegations of paragraph 29 as written in the present tense.
26 Since Respondent was not successful in the last election cycle, he no longer "must

1 stand for election every four years.”

2 10. Respondent denies the allegations of paragraph 30 as written.

3 11. Regarding paragraph 31, Respondent admits that the content of the “Breakfast with
4 the Judge” website, when it existed, was revised periodically, but Respondent cannot
5 respond to how Disciplinary Counsel has tried to define the website on various dates,
6 and on that basis denies the same.

7 12. Respondent denies the allegations of paragraph 32 as written.

8 13. Regarding paragraph 33, Respondent admits that the content of his campaign website,
9 when it existed, was revised periodically, but Respondent cannot respond to how
10 Disciplinary Counsel has tried to define the website on various dates and, in that basis
11 denies the same.

12 14. Respondent admits the allegations of paragraph 34.

13 15. Responding to paragraphs 35 through 40, Respondent notes that his December 2,
14 2014 response speaks for itself but Respondent denies the broad allegation that a
15 judge’s email address is non-public information or that the addressees who received
16 the email all had non-public email accounts. Respondent is aware, based on personal
17 knowledge and, therefore alleges on information and belief, that many of the justices
18 of the peace in Maricopa County and others communicate with individuals from their
19 court email addresses to third parties outside the Maricopa County Court system, and
20 often such emails are about subjects unrelated to their judicial duties. Such
21 communications may defeat the allegation that email accounts issued by the
22 Administrative Office of the Courts are, or have remained, non-public information.
23 Respondent further denies that he received or had the email information solely in
24 connection with his judicial role. Additionally, Respondent denies that he used court
25 staff, facilities, or other court resources in his campaign for judicial office. Further,
26 Respondent does not concede that the email referred to in the allegations was not in

1 any way related to judicial duties. Specifically, Respondent affirmatively alleges and
2 notes that the approach taken with the email was part of an effort to effectuate the
3 directive from the Arizona Supreme Court as noted in its publication, "Advancing
4 Justice Together, Courts and Communities 2014-2016" where the Court said, among
5 other things, "[i]n a world of nearly instantaneous access to information, Arizona
6 courts must be proactive in communicating with the general public, *elected officials*
7 *and other government entities.*" (emphasis added).

8 16. Responding to paragraphs 41 through 42, Respondent admits that his campaign
9 committee sponsored and held a fundraiser at Turf Paradise in November of 2014.
10 Exhibit 2 to the Statement includes the notation "Paid for by Jayne 2016." To the
11 extent stated or implied in the allegations, Respondent denies that he directly solicited
12 or accepted campaign contributions other than through his campaign committee.
13 Respondent further notes that Exhibit 3 to the Statement appears to be cut-off at the
14 bottom and may not show all the information included in the original.

15 17. Responding to paragraphs 43 through 56, Respondent notes first that Exhibit 4
16 reflects clearly that the document was promoted through Respondent's campaign
17 committee and the document speaks for itself. To the extent the presentation of
18 quotes or comments as alleged in paragraph 43 imply something inappropriate on
19 Respondent's part, Respondent denies the same. While Respondent acknowledges the
20 obligation of his committee to file periodic campaign reports, Respondent denies that
21 there was information withheld or not provided. Respondent notes that the December
22 4, 2014 report mentioned in paragraph 49 reflected an amount for the November 22,
23 2014 event. The report identified the net proceeds to the Committee after non-
24 purchased items were sold at a silent auction, thereby disclosing the net fundraising
25 amount rather than the potentially confusing "double counting" of auction items to be
26 sold and the resulting sales amount received being reported individually. Respondent

1 further states that the statement regarding "\$5,000" as received at the Turf Paradise
2 event included the estimated "fair value" of the auction items to be sold. As described
3 below, Respondent believes that the Commission does not have jurisdiction to
4 determine whether Respondent's campaign finance reports referred to in the
5 allegations were properly completed, that pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 16-905(K) and 16-
6 916(A)(2), such authority rests only with the Maricopa County Recorder and County
7 Attorney, and in the absence of a timely filed complaint with respect to such reports,
8 they are deemed accepted and valid as filed. Furthermore, under A.R.S. § 16-904, the
9 Treasurer of a campaign committee is responsible for campaign finance reports, and
10 such officer is not subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission. However, in
11 cooperation with the Commission, Respondent is willing to consider filing amended
12 reports to reflect the matters as the Commission may determine appropriate. To the
13 extent the allegations in paragraphs 50-56 are intended to state or imply that
14 Respondent did not cooperate with the Commission, Respondent denies the same.
15 Respondent otherwise denies the allegations except as noted and discussed above and
16 Respondent denies that he knowingly or with reckless disregard made any statement
17 that would be deceiving or misleading to the reasonable person or that he failed to
18 comply with campaign fund-raising laws and/or regulations.

19 18. Responding to paragraphs 57 through 60, Respondent notes that the record for case
20 no. 2012-104 speaks for itself and Respondent does not concede the characterization
21 of that record. To the extent the Statement suggests that on or about November 3,
22 2014 the webpage showed "corporate sponsors," Respondent denies that he knew
23 about it at the time, affirmatively states that he had previously directed his webpage
24 person to take down the references to corporate sponsors and found, after the fact that
25 a new webpage person had inadvertently put the sponsor information back up. Once
26 Respondent knew about it, the information was taken down, as is reflected in the

1 statement in paragraph 60 that the 2016 Breakfast with the Judge webpage no longer
2 contains references to corporate sponsors—an allegation to which Respondent agrees.
3 Respondent denies that he received material benefits, denies that the Breakfast with
4 the Judge meetings abused the prestige of the judicial office, and denies that such
5 meetings and/or advertisements about such meetings can or did convey an impression
6 that a person could influence Respondent. Respondent further denies that any activity
7 related to the Breakfast with the Judge meetings could or did undermine his
8 independence, impartiality or integrity in the discharge of his judicial duties. Rather,
9 Respondent affirmatively alleges and notes that the Breakfast with the Judge meetings
10 were undertaken as part of an effort to effectuate the directive from the Arizona
11 Supreme Court as noted in its publication, “Advancing Justice Together, Courts and
12 Communities 2014-2016” where the Court said, among other things, “[i]n a world of
13 nearly instantaneous access to information, Arizona courts must be proactive in
14 communicating with the general public, elected officials and other government
15 entities.” The Court added that Arizona courts should “[c]ommunicate effectively
16 with the public about the role of courts in a free society, how courts serve our
17 communities, and progress in achieving this agenda’s goals” and to “[p]romote civic
18 education”.

19 19. Responding to paragraphs 61 to 64, Respondent incorporates the comments made in
20 paragraph 18 above regarding the Breakfast with the Judge gatherings and denies that
21 any of the activities constituted direct solicitation of funds by Respondent for such
22 events. Exhibit 8 attached to the Statement is a bad copy so its text is not legible, but
23 Respondent notes that such events are typically indicated as “Paid for by Jayne 2016”,
24 meaning Respondent’s committee was handling the advertising. Exhibit 9 attached to
25 the Statement says “Paid for by Jayne 2016.” Respondent otherwise denies the
26 allegations, particularly to the extent they are meant to say or imply that Respondent

1 made direct solicitations for funds.

2 20. Responding to paragraphs 65 through 72, Respondent denies the allegations to the
3 extent that they say or are intended to imply that Respondent invited, permitted or
4 considered any *ex parte* communications concerning a pending or impending matter at
5 the Desert Ridge Justice Court. Respondent further denies the allegations to the
6 extent that they say or imply that he acted in a manner that did not promote public
7 confidence in his independence, integrity or impartiality. The record in case no.
8 2014-055 speaks for itself. Respondent incorporates the affirmative allegations in
9 paragraph 18 above and notes that his website was intended to fulfill the Supreme
10 Court's directive that courts should "[i]ncrease the use of social media to improve
11 communications with the public." Respondent admits that he added the disclaimers to
12 his website as noted in paragraphs 70 and 72.

13 21. Responding to paragraphs 73-74, Respondent denies the allegations to the extent that
14 they say or are intended to imply that Respondent endorsed another candidate for
15 public office. Respondent admits that he has a truck, but denies that he put the sign
16 on his truck or that it was intended to reflect an endorsement—at most it was intended
17 to reflect who was in the truck at the time.

18 22. Responding to paragraphs 75-76, Respondent admits that his truck has a photo of
19 himself and the statements but otherwise denies that allegations to the extent they say
20 or imply that the information on Plaintiff's truck are public statements that might
21 reasonably be expected to affect the outcome of any matter before him or that would
22 impair his fairness in adjudicating any matter pending or impending in his court.
23 Respondent further denies that the information on the truck reflects actions that would
24 not promote public confidence in his independence, integrity and impartiality.

25 23. Responding to paragraphs 77-84, Respondent denies the allegations as written and
26 states that the correspondence between him and Disciplinary Counsel as mentioned

1 speaks for itself and Respondent does not concede the characterizations of such
2 material as alleged. Respondent denies the allegation in paragraph 78 that a “wearer
3 of the shirt could be mistaken for an employee or someone affiliated with the court”
4 and further denies the allegations to the extent they say or imply that Respondent
5 abused the prestige of the judicial office or that he advanced his own personal or
6 economic interest. Further, Respondent denies that he failed to cooperate with the
7 Commission.

8 24. Responding to paragraphs 85 through 89, Respondent admits that a campaign sign
9 inadvertently reflected prior endorsements and that the Arizona Chamber of
10 Commerce asked Respondent to correct the error and he instructed his campaign
11 committee to do so. Respondent admits the allegations of paragraph 89. Respondent
12 otherwise denies the allegations as written and denies that his conduct materially
13 violated Rules 4.2 or 4.3 of the Code.

14 25. Responding to paragraphs 90 through 91, Respondent admits that he spoke to a
15 reporter, thinking the reporter was a friend and did not anticipate that the reporter
16 would publish his comments. The language reported in the Yellow Sheet Article is as
17 written and Respondent does not concede how the language is quoted or
18 characterized. Respondent denies that the comments reflect on, or should cast doubt
19 on, his temperament and fitness to serve as a judge, particularly since the comments
20 have nothing to do with any matter before Respondent or the actual operation of
21 Respondent’s court by Respondent.

22 26. Responding to paragraphs 92 through 111, they are mixed statements of fact and legal
23 conclusions. As to the legal conclusions, the statements do not require a specific
24 response. As to the statements of fact, Respondent incorporates his responses to
25 paragraphs 1-91 above. Nevertheless, Respondent generally denies the violations of
26 the Code as alleged in the Statement.

1 27. Pursuant to Commission Rule 27(f)(7), Respondent identifies the following mitigating
2 factors that are, or may be, relevant to the charges identified in the Statement:

3 a. None of the charges or facts alleged relating to such charges refer or relate to
4 Respondent's actual performance as a Justice of the Peace and/or his conduct
5 while on the bench. Respondent asserts that his performance on the bench has
6 been effective and exemplary with respect to the matters, parties and counsel
7 that have appeared in his court. Respondent expects to call witnesses who may
8 testify as to his performance on the bench and his general good character and
9 temperament to serve on the bench.

10 b. Respondent's public outreach and use of social media reflect an effort on his
11 part to effectuate directives from the Arizona Supreme Court as noted above.
12 As long as such activity did not result (which is the case) in any violation of
13 the Code with respect to Respondent's actual work on the bench, there is
14 significant inconsistency in the Commission's apparent interpretation of the
15 Code's provisions and the direct statements the Supreme Court has outlined as
16 aspirational objectives for members of the bench.

17 c. Respondent contends the charges asserted against him violate the Equal
18 Protection Clauses of the Arizona and United States Constitutions.
19 Specifically, and in the first instance, Respondent is being charged with having
20 social media outlets (mostly associated with his campaign committee) that
21 allegedly invite possible *ex parte* communications or that could be viewed as
22 providing legal advice. Some court websites in the State invite
23 communications from the public with general inquiries that would allow
24 questions from the public or allow the public to seek help. One example is at
25 <http://justicecourts.maricopa.gov/Forms/CourtEmail.aspx?loc=DR>. These
26 websites do not have disclaimers indicating the court cannot engage in *ex parte*

1 communications or provide legal advice, yet Respondent is criticized when his
2 websites did not have such disclaimers. In the second instance, Respondent is
3 being charged with making statements that might affect the outcome of a
4 matter before him, that would impair the fairness of a matter pending or
5 impending in his court, or that do not promote the public confidence in
6 Respondent's independence, integrity and impartiality. The Maricopa County
7 website currently hosts a Facebook page on which judges, justices and other
8 court personnel post statements that are at least as declarative, if not more so,
9 regarding policy and issues affecting issues that may come before the many
10 Maricopa County courts. See www.facebook.com/SuperiorCourtOfArizona/.
11 The Maricopa County Justice Court Facebook page is similar. See
12 <https://www.facebook.com/MaricopaCountyJusticeCourts/>. If government
13 sponsored, court websites can invite such communications from the public, and
14 include material making express and implicit statements regarding issues,
15 Respondent should not be subject to discipline if his website or truck signage
16 ostensibly did the same thing. As such, the charges as framed here deny
17 Respondent his right to equal protection and/or equal privileges and
18 immunities under the law.


- 19 d. The Commission lacks jurisdiction to determine the propriety of the campaign
20 finance reports for Respondent's campaigns under Arizona's campaign finance
21 statutes. Further, this issue is moot because the filing officer (the Maricopa
22 County Recorder) and the enforcing officer (the Maricopa County Attorney)
23 neither received, investigated nor made any findings of fact indicating in any
24 way that the campaign finance reports at issue here contained information that
25 did not state fully the contributions and/or expenses as required by Arizona
26 law, and because no other timely complaint was filed with respect to such

1 campaign finance reports, their completion and compliance is not open for
2 Commission consideration. That Respondent's campaign email referred to the
3 gross amount raised rather than the net amount raised (as did the campaign
4 finance reports in question) does not support the conclusion that Respondent in
5 any way knowingly or recklessly deceived or mislead any reasonable person or
6 violated Arizona campaign finance laws.

7 e. Respondent respectfully does not waive any other argument, claim or right that
8 may not be called out specifically here. As the matter and discovery proceeds,
9 Respondent reserves the right to assert any other claim or argument called for
10 based on the evidence and/or law.

11
12 WHEREFORE, Respondent requests that the charges as framed in the Statement be
13 dismissed.
