PROP 203 APPROVED

JUDICIAL AND PROBATION OFFICERS ENCOURAGED TO VIEW INFORMATIVE WEBCAST

ARIZONA – Proposition 203 was approved by Arizona voters at the November 2, 2010 general election. The initiative adopted Chapter 28.1 of Title 36 of the Arizona Revised Statutes, formally known as the Arizona Medical Marijuana Act. This new law became effective on December 15, 2010. It will be implemented mid April, 2011.

Join expert presenters as they examine this new act and answer your questions about its impact on Arizona courts. This program will have immediate interest for judicial officers and staff who handle drug offenses in the criminal and juvenile courts. The program will include information about crimes and defenses under the Act, and it will also identify civil actions that might be filed under the new Title 36 statutes as well as other potential issues.
