In accordance with Administrative Order No. 90-13, as revised on June 6, 1990, the Chief Justice may establish advisory committees to the Arizona Judicial Council to assist the Council in carrying out its responsibilities. The Fiduciary Advisory Commission was established by Chief Justice Charles E. Jones in August 2002 through adoption of Administrative Order No. 2002-92. The Commission was charged with making recommendations to improve the quality, consistency and coordination of fiduciary and court procedures statewide to help ensure the ethics and standards of professional fiduciaries are adequate for the protection of the state's vulnerable populations and the general public.

The work of the Commission resulted in implementation of a number of significant changes, including modifications to the qualifications of fiduciaries and the examination for certification, training for judicial officers and oversight tools for judges. This Commission has now completed its work and should be dissolved.

Therefore, pursuant to Article VI, Section 3, of the Arizona Constitution,

IT IS ORDERED that the Fiduciary Advisory Commission is disbanded and closed, effective upon date of this Order.
