## COUNCIL ON JUDICIAL ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE ON PROBATION

Administrative Order No. 88-3

In accordance with Administrative Order No. 87-17, the Chief Justice may establish standing committees to the Council on Judicial Administration to assist the Council in carrying out its responsibilities. Now, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. A standing committee on probation is hereby established as a committee of the Council on Judicial Administration and shall be known as the Committee on Probation.

2. The purpose of this committee is to examine current probation procedures and to develop a plan that will promote standardization, consistency and coordination of probation procedures statewide.

3. Committee leadership and members of the committee shall be appointed by the Chief Justice. Committee members shall include chief probation officers, chief juvenile probation officers or juvenile court directors, selected judges, and the director of the Program Services Division of the Administrative Office of the Courts.
