COUNCIL ON JUDICIAL ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE ON JURY MANAGEMENT

Administrative Order No. 88-4

In accordance with Administrative Order No. 87-17, the Chief Justice may establish advisory committees to the Council on Judicial Administration to assist the Council in carrying out its responsibilities. Now, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. A committee on jury management is hereby established as an advisory committee of the Council on Judicial Administration and shall be known as the Committee on Jury Management.
- 2. The purpose of this committee shall be to examine existing statutes and rules and to determine to what extent these statutes and rules deviate from the American Bar Association standards on jury management and whether or not they should be conformed to the ABA standards. The committee should also review jury management procedures statewide to determine court compliance with current statutes and rules; hindrances to adopting new standards; and training and education programs needed to assist all those in the judiciary involved in jury management in implementing any changes recommended by the Council on Judicial Administration and adopted by the Supreme Court.
- 3. This committee shall investigate all possible sources of assistance for implementation of the recommendations made by the committee.
- 4. Committee leadership and members of the committee shall be appointed by the Chief Justice.
