## SUPREME COURT OF ARIZONA

APPOINTMENT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE TO DEVELOP EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS CONCERNING THE RIGHTS OF VICTIMS AND OTHER WITNESSES

Administrative Order No. 89 - 21

The Court finds it appropriate to appoint a committee of persons familiar with the needs and concerns of victims and other witnesses to develop educational materials and programs addressing the role of victims and witnesses in the criminal justice system and the role of court system professionals toward victims and witnesses. Materials and programs should be developed with the goal of assuring victims and witnesses are well-informed participants at each point of contact with the system. Now, therefore, pursuant to the supervisory authority granted in Article VI, Section 3 of the Arizona Constitution,

IT IS ORDERED THAT a special committee is hereby established whose duties include developing educational materials and programs concerning victims and other witnesses who participate in the criminal justice process and obtaining by grant or other appropriate means the funding necessary for the materials and programs developed.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT the committee be composed of a County Attorney/Attorney General representative, a public defender representative, a judge, a private attorney, a victim/witness counselor, a citizen victim/witness, a probation officer, and two legislative representatives and other interested persons to be appointed by the Chief Justice.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT Administrative Order 89-9 is hereby rescinded.
