

COMMITTEE ON DEFENSIVE DRIVING



Administrative Order No.
90-42

In accordance with Administrative Order No. 90-13, the Chief Justice may establish advisory committees to the Arizona Judicial Council to assist the Council in carrying out its responsibilities. Now, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED THAT an advisory committee on defensive driving diversion programs is hereby established and shall be known as the Committee on Defensive Driving.

Purposes. The Committee on Defensive Driving shall:

1. Advise the Defensive Driving Program staff on program operational policy matters including providing continued input to the rules, procedures and standards for defensive driving school curriculum and the school and instructor certification and monitoring processes.
2. Provide input on policies and procedures affecting the statewide defensive driving tracking system database.
3. Assist in recommending and approving additional defensive driving curriculum components and services.
4. Provide at least one member on a rotating basis to the Defensive Driving School Certification Appeals Board.

Reports and Recommendations. The Committee shall issue reports and recommendations as requested or required by the Supreme Court, the Administrative Director, or the Arizona Judicial Council. The reports and recommendations issued by the Committee shall be circulated to all appropriate committees of the Arizona Judicial Council for consideration and comment, prior to submission to the Council and/or the Supreme Court.

Organization. Committee membership and leadership shall be appointed by the Chief Justice. The Committee chair may appoint a vice-chair and subcommittees to assist the Committee in carrying out its responsibilities.

Meetings. All meetings shall be noticed and open to the public.

Staff. Under direction of the Chief Justice, the Administrative Office of the Courts shall provide staff for the Committee and may conduct or coordinate research as recommended by the Committee.
