

REVISION OF WORDING FOR JUDICIAL STAFF EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS Administrative Order No. 96-<u>16</u> (Revising Administrative Order 95-45)

On August 1, 1995, by Administrative Order 95-45, the Supreme Court adopted recommendations of the Committee on Judicial Education and Training to require judicial staff to obtain education in certain areas in both orientation and in continuing education.

Upon review of the Order it has been noted that the word "should" appearing in Section F, subsections 4 and 5 a. was intended to read "shall" to reflect this requirement.

Now, therefore, pursuant to Article VI Section 3 of the Arizona Constitution,

IT IS ORDERED that Administrative Order 95-45 be amended to change the word "should" Section F, subsections 4 and 5 a., to the word "shall."
