This matter came to the court as an original special action. After considering the written briefs and oral arguments of the parties, the court issued its written opinion on June 16, 1998.

The petitioner and real parties in interest have now filed a

joint motion in which they agree that the school finance legislation signed into law by the petitioner on July 9, 1998 is facially valid and, therefore, that no constitutional challenges to the statutes remain pending.

It thus appears to the court, there being no constitutional questions before us, the matter is now moot.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED vacating the 60-day time limit established by this court in its June 16, 1998 opinion within which the state was permitted to distribute funds to the public school system.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED vacating any and all orders of the Maricopa County Superior Court prohibiting the state from distributing funds to the public school system.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the respondent judge shall terminate Maricopa County Superior Court Cause No. CV-91-13087, after first disposing of ancillary tasks necessary to accomplish termination.
