This matter came before the Disciplinary Commission of the Supreme Court of Arizona on March 12, 2005, pursuant to Rule 58, Ariz. R. S. Ct., for consideration of the Hearing Officer's Report filed February 8, 2005 recommending acceptance of the Tender of Admissions and Agreement for Discipline by Consent (Agreement) and Joint Memorandum in Support of Agreement for Discipline by Consent (Joint Memorandum) providing for a sixty day suspension, two years of probation upon reinstatement with the State Bar's Law Office Management Assistance Program (LOMAP including a practice monitor), participation in the State Bar's Member Assistance Program (MAP), and costs of these disciplinary proceedings.

**Decision**

The eight<sup>1</sup> members of the Disciplinary Commission unanimously recommend accepting and adopting the Hearing Officer's findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendation for a sixty day suspension, two years of probation upon
