No. 2 Discussion and possible action regarding Former State Bar Ethics Opinions

o Op. 95-03

Hon. Kim Ortiz presented.

Hon. Kim Ortiz discusses if Arizona should change EO 95-03, originally issued in 1995. The Ethics Opinion addresses the issue of when a lawyer my ethically record a conversation. Generally, a non-lawyer may record a conversation if one party consents to the recording. Generally, a lawyer may not record a conversation without the consent of all parties.

The Opinion contains four exceptions for the recording policy: crime, protect perjury, criminal cases, to be used with an informant or someone under investigation or if the recording is approved by another court statute, rule or order. The question brought forth for the Committee is if the Committee wants to expand exceptions, for example to include recording conversations with clients, witnesses and council.
