Personal Biographical Statement:

I was born in Denver, grew up in Colorado, and am the oldest of three sisters. My parents owned a house moving business where my father managed a crew of hard-working men. My mother was the office manager and bookkeeper, making the payroll, paying the bills and taxes, and procuring the various permits necessary for moving houses.

I enjoyed school, was an excellent student and received an academic scholarship to college. I majored in English and obtained a teaching certificate for secondary education. I love music and played French horn through high school and college. I was always active in my church, leading the youth group.

Girl Scouting was my favorite activity outside school. I earned many badges and awards. My family loved the outdoors and often would take our entire troop into the Colorado mountains for camping trips. I attended an International Roundup with Girl Scouts and Girl Guides from around the world. I achieved the highest Girl Scouting honors, the Gold, Silver, and Bronze awards.

My career as a social worker began with services for the elderly confined to nursing homes. I also worked as a Psychiatric Technician at the Colorado State Hospital and for the Arapahoe County Mental Health Clinic, completing psychiatric assessments and providing crisis intervention services.

Child Protective Services was the primary focus of my career, starting as a front-line worker making home visits, appearing in court, working with Guardians Ad Litem and judges to develop the best plans of care for children. I became a supervisor and advanced into management positions at the state level overseeing the state Child Protective Services, Adoption and Foster Care Programs and directing the

development of the new Child Welfare Services Information System as Executive Director of Children's Services for the State of Colorado.

My husband and I retired early to Arizona in 1999. Shortly afterward, I began working part-time as a social worker for Hospice of the Valley where I worked for ten years. My husband and I are active in our church, and in service to the community. He was elected to the Fire Board in Sun City West and has served there for 12 years. The organization has grown to become the Arizona Fire and Medical Authority.

I am a member of the American Association of University Women, (AAUW) a national nonpartisan organization which promotes education for women and girls. I served as president of the local Northwest Valley AAUW branch in 2004. I also am a member of the Northwest Maricopa County League of Women Voters, (LWV) a nonpartisan organization which takes positions on issues, not candidates. We inform and educate voters. I served as president of this branch in 2008.

As an Associate Professor at the Graduate Schools of Social Work at both the University of Denver and ASU, I taught courses in Social Work Practice and Social Policy. I also taught an advanced social work course in Palliative Care for the University of Southern California.

Mentoring is one of my callings, and I currently continue to serve as a Field Instructor for the ASU School of Social Work supervising internships for both BA and MA level Social Work Students. My church provides scholarships for low income students enabling them to attend two years at local community colleges. Through this program, I also mentor two students.

For the past six years, I have served as Chair of the Board for a nonprofit called Northwest Valley Connect (NVC). (My term will end December 31, 2020.) Public transportation is minimal in the west valley. Bell Road, for example, has no bus services west of the 101, through Peoria, Sun City, Surprise, and Sun City West. Using volunteers, NVC provides rides for seniors, veterans, and disabled persons in the west valley. In 2019, we provided 16,000 rides to medical care, shopping, and social outings. With the onset of COVID, we have pivoted services to include assisting our clients to order groceries online, with our volunteer drivers delivering the food. Grocery stores charge delivery fees, NVC does not.

We have a daughter and two adult granddaughters in Wyoming. One of them is married with children so we have two great-granddaughters. Our daughter, one of her daughters and our grandson-in-law are all teachers. My husband and I also have a son who graduated from ASU with a business degree. He is a mortgage financing officer in Dallas with his wife and three daughters, our granddaughters. We celebrated three graduations in Texas this year. The twins graduated college while the youngest granddaughter graduated high school.

I enjoy good health and am physically active. I enjoy hiking, biking, and fishing. I have a motorcycle license and a private pilot's license. My husband and I enjoy travel and have seen many thrilling places around the world. We are active in community service and take pleasure in making a difference.

I believe serving on the IRC is a vitally important contribution to the community. I want to make a positive difference. As a career social worker with specific training in mediation, I have special skills in problem solving and conflict resolution. I passionately believe I can act in an honest, independent, and impartial fashion.
