The Certification and Licensing Division ("Division") received a complaint against EZ AZ Traffic School alleging:

- 1. EZ AZ Traffic School failed to report the theft of up to \$250,000.00 of student school fees
- 2. EZ AZ Traffic School failed to report a change in school owners.

Please reference the Division's Investigation Summary and Probable Cause Analysis and Determination Report for full details on the Division's investigation.

In summary, the Division's investigation did not find evidence, nor did Complainant provide evidence that substantiated Complainant's two allegations including the allegation that EZ AZ Traffic School's owner, Paul Hallums, had knowledge of and failed to report the theft of up to \$250,000.00 from his defensive driving school(s).

Records demonstrated that EZ AZ Traffic School paid diversion and state fees. There are no records of complaints from either the courts regarding non-payment of fees or from students whose drivers' licenses would be adversely affected if defensive driving school course completions were not reported and/or requisite fees were not paid by EZ AZ Traffic School.

### **Recommendation:**

On April 30, 2019, the Probable Cause Evaluator determined that probable cause of a violation does not exist. Division staff recommends that the Board accept the determination of the Probable Cause Evaluator and dismiss complaint number 18-D006.
