O R D E R

Plaintiffs/Appellants Leibsohn, *et al.*, filed a Notice of Appeal and a request for initial telephonic scheduling conference on August 17, 2022 in this expedited election matter, pursuant to Rule 10(g), Arizona Rules of Civil Appellate Procedure.

The Court has been apprised that the deadline to decide this case is August 25, 2022. Appellants will be presenting a transcript or summary forthwith.

The parties have reached a stipulation on the pertinent

scheduling matters, and therefore the requested initial telephonic scheduling conference is no longer necessary.

As stipulated to by the parties,

IT IS ORDERED Appellants will file the opening brief no later than 10:00 a.m. on Friday, August 19, 2022.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED Real Party in Interest/Appellee will file an answering brief no later than 10:00 a.m. on Saturday August 20, 2022.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the reply will be filed no later than 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, August 21, 2022.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that amicus briefs be filed no later than 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 20, 2022. The parties give blanket consent to the filing of amicus briefs.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a party's response to amicus briefs will be filed no later than 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 21, 2022.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the briefs may be in memorandum format (no tables of contents or authorities) in a legible font (14-point), double-spaced, with the briefs to include all arguments the parties wish to present to the Court. The opening brief and answering brief will be no more than 4,000 words; any reply will be no more than 3,500 words; any amicus briefs will be no more than 3,500 words; and any response to amicus briefs will be no more than 3,500 words. This matter will be decided without oral argument.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in addition to filing briefs with the

Clerk of the Supreme Court (with filing and service through AZTurboCourt), all filings are also simultaneously to be sent by email to all the parties and court staff at the time of the filing.

The Court, having been apprised that Appellants have filed a Motion to Amend the Judgment, sua sponte, and pursuant to ARCAP 3(b),

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED revesting jurisdiction in the superior court for the purpose of considering the motion and entering an amended judgment if warranted. However, because the matter needs to be fully briefed by the agreed-upon deadline, none of the deadlines in this order will be suspended, unless there is a showing of good cause.
