Arizona Supreme Court Celebrates National Service Recognition Day

PHOENIX – AmeriCorps, the only federal agency tasked with elevating service and volunteerism in America, engages more than 270,000 AmeriCorps members and AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers in national service at more than 40,000 locations each year.

Through partnerships with schools, faith-based groups, nonprofits, and local agencies, national service members are embedded within the communities they serve, using their ingenuity and training to make a tangible, lasting impact. Whether responding to natural disasters, tackling the opioid epidemic, educating students for the 21st century workforce, or supporting veterans and military families, AmeriCorps helps local leaders strengthen their communities.

National Service Recognition Day is an annual initiative that takes place the first Tuesday in April, and is led by AmeriCorps, the National League of Cities, the National Association of Counties, and Cities of Service. Mayors and city leaders, county officials, and tribal leaders across the country are using national service more and more to solve their community's toughest challenges. The Arizona Supreme Court joins these leaders in sharing thanks and appreciation for the positive impact of AmeriCorps members and AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers in their communities.
