Arizona Code of Judicial Administration (ACJA) § 6-113 (P)(1) provides: “An officer may only carry and use the firearm and ammunition that are approved by the AOC as their duty weapons.”

Pursuant to ACJA § 6-113 (P)(1), the Administrative Office of the Courts hereby approves as duty weapons Glock handguns chambered in .40 S&W or 9mm with a minimum factory magazine capacity of 13 rounds.

The Speer Gold Dot 180 gr Jacketed Hollow Point .40 S&W cartridge and the Speer Gold Dot 9mm 124 gr +P Jacketed Hollow Point 9mm cartridge are the approved ammunition for duty carry.

The chief probation officer or director of juvenile court services may select approved firearms chambered in one or both .40 S&W and 9mm to issue as duty weapons.

The chief probation officer or director of juvenile court services may issue a secondary Glock handgun chambered in .40 S&W or 9mm, with no minimum magazine capacity requirement, to a warrants officer or fugitive apprehension officer who is a specialized non-case carrying officer assigned full-time to the duties of locating and arresting individuals on warrant status.

ACJA § 6-113 (T)(1) provides: “The chief probation officer may approve a warrants officer or fugitive apprehension officer who is a specialized non-case carrying officer assigned full-time to the duties of locating and arresting individuals on warrant status to carry a long gun.” ACJA (T)(4) provides: “The long gun and ammunition must be consistent with standards established by AOC.”

Pursuant to ACJA § 6-113 (P)(1) and (T)(4), the Administrative Office of the Courts hereby establishes the following long gun and ammunition for Arizona probation use.

Daniel Defense AR 15 .223/5.56 caliber Rifle w/ 12.5 inch
barrel Duty round Federal 55 grain TRU Sierra gameking

ACJA § 6-113 (P)(7) provides: “The chief probation officer or director of juvenile court services shall approve holsters for the authorized handgun based on guidelines issued by the AOC.”

Pursuant to ACJA § 6-113 (P)(7), the Administrative Office of the Courts hereby establishes and issues the following guidelines for duty firearm holsters for Arizona probation use.

A. Holsters shall:

1. Be readily concealable;
2. Properly fit the firearm;
3. Cover the trigger guard of the firearm; and
4. Contain at least one (1) retention device other than friction.

B. A Chief Probation Officer or Juvenile Court Director may authorize a warrants officer or fugitive apprehension officer to place approved holsters for primary and secondary duty weapons in a manner that enhances access and concealment while wearing specialized gear.

Therefore, pursuant to ACJA § 6-113 (P)(1), (P)(7), (T)(1), and (T)(4),

IT IS DIRECTED that the authorized firearms, ammunition and holster guidelines established above are adopted and shall serve as the basis for purchasing and wearing duty firearms and firearm holsters, effective this date.
