Officers Not Eligible for Certification.** Contractors, volunteers, or off-duty police officers who perform court security duties must complete the Court Security Officer Training Academy required in subsection (E) within 90 days of beginning work at the court. On-duty police officers assigned to perform security duties at the court may attend the Court Security Officer Training Academy.~~

HG. Reporting Requirements. The local training coordinator shall ensure that all court security officer training is included in the annual Committee on Judicial Education and Training compliance report.
