STRUCTURES FEES ) No. 2021 - 123  
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Pursuant to Rules of the Arizona Supreme Court, Rule 33.1 and ACJA § 7-209, business entities may be licensed to provide legal services in Arizona.

ACJA § 7-209(J) establishes the fee structure for initial licensure and renewal of licensure applications. A portion of the fees collected is to fund the State Bar of Arizona's cost of investigating and prosecuting alleged ethical misconduct of a licensed Alternative Business Structure.

The recommended portions of the application fees collected to be forwarded quarterly to the State Bar of Arizona are:

Initial Applications Fees:

International	\$1,000
Large – Non-Law Firm	\$1,000
Small – Non-Law Firm	\$500
Non-Profit – Not Arizona	\$500
Arizona Non-Profit	\$500
All Law Firms – Any Size	\$500

Renewal Application Fees:

International	\$1,000
Large – Non-Law Firm	\$1,000
Small – Non-Law Firm	\$500
Non-Profit – Not Arizona	\$500
Arizona Non-Profit	\$500
All Law Firms – Any Size	\$500

Therefore, pursuant to Article VI, Section 3, of the Arizona Constitution,

IT IS ORDERED that the State Bar of Arizona be paid from collected initial and renewal licensure application fees the portion of the application fees described above to fund the cost of investigating and prosecuting alleged ethical misconduct of a licensed Alternative Business Structure.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Administrative Office of the Courts shall make such payments to the State Bar of Arizona on a quarterly basis.
