I. Juror Biographical Information. To reduce the time required for voir dire, basic background information regarding panel members, as required by Rules 47~~(a)(4)~~~~(b)~~ of the Arizona Rules of Civil Procedure and 18.3 of the Arizona Rules of Criminal Procedure, shall be made available to counsel for each party on the day on which jury selection is to begin. The jury commissioner shall obtain and maintain such information as to each potential juror in a manner and form to be approved by the supreme court.
