Pursuant to Article VI, Section 3, of the Arizona Constitution, the Supreme Court exercises administrative supervision over all courts of the state.

The Honorable David M. Haws, Presiding Judge of the Superior Court in Yuma County, was tasked with administrative control and oversight of the day-to-day operations of the San Luis Municipal Court in Administrative Order No. 2023-04. It has come to the Court's attention that a magistrate has been appointed for the San Luis Municipal Court to begin on December 18, 2023. To assist in the transition to the newly appointed magistrate, Judge Haws has agreed to continue providing oversight.

Therefore, pursuant to Article VI, Section 3, of the Arizona Constitution,

IT IS ORDERED that the Honorable David M. Haws, Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Arizona in Yuma County, shall continue to exercise administrative control and oversight of day-to-day operations of the San Luis Municipal Court to assist in the transition to the newly appointed magistrate. Judge Haws is authorized to assign judicial officers as needed to conduct court business and to issue such orders as necessary for the court to operate properly.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order replaces Administrative Order No. 2023-04 and shall remain in effect until June 18, 2024, unless otherwise ordered. Any cost associated with operating this court, including cost for judicial officers, shall be a municipal cost.
