On September 11, 2024, this Court issued Administrative Order No. 2024-178, which authorized the Juvenile Court in Maricopa County to use alternative standard conditions of probation as compared to the Uniform Conditions of Supervised Juvenile Probation required in Arizona Code of Judicial Administration (ACJA) § 6-307. Authorization by Maricopa County, and other counties at their discretion, to use the alternative conditions commenced on October 1, 2024 and was to remain in effect until December 31, 2025, unless otherwise ordered by this Court. This authorization was the result of a state-wide initiative to align juvenile conditions of probation with current research and best practices.

The Juvenile Court in Maricopa County has requested an extension to the original expiration date of the pilot so that they may continue to use an alternative set of conditions entitled Rules of Supervised Probation for an additional twelve months.

Therefore, pursuant to Article VI, Section 3, of the Arizona Constitution,

IT IS ORDERED that the Juvenile Court in Maricopa County is authorized to continue its use of an alternative form to the Uniform Conditions of Supervised Juvenile Probation required in ACJA § 6-307 as part of a pilot program which began October 1, 2024.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the pilot program may now remain in effect until December 31, 2026, unless otherwise ordered by this Court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all other conditions in the original Administrative Order remain in effect.
